- 1. The minutes of the August 5<sup>th</sup> meeting were read and approved with following modification to paragraph 5.b. add "linking cost to alternatives".
- 2. Schedule Because the Capital Committee is meeting on August 26<sup>th</sup>, and our next scheduled meeting occurs that day, we will start at 9:30am. Peter asked that we consider meeting on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup>, rather than 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursdays to avoid conflict with Capital Planning. This will be discussed at the next meeting.
- 3. Doug C. reported that the Design Team discussed the projects and process with Energy Advisory Committee member, Forest Hodgkins. Doug also visited a building in Acton with characteristics similar to Town Hall, Acton Exchange Building; the owner is willing to give us his 'lessons learned'.
- 4. Pete J. reported that he continues to develop the program for Town Government.
- 5. Carlene P. reported that Maggie Green helped COA understand the scope and technique of programming. They handed out a report (attached)
- 6. Willie W. and Pat J. reported on the progress of the Community Center group. Peter W. asked that they make a presentation to the BOS on August 17<sup>th</sup>. Pete J. suggested that they consider the impact of competition from the two churches on the Common. The committee as a whole endorsed their report (attached) and offered the following considerations:
  - a. Public involvement in the process, both at the outset and regularly throughout, is critical;
  - b. Tracking of various statistics (characterization of the types of activities, attendance, utilization of the various rooms, revenue, expenses, etc) is essential;
  - c. Exploration of organizational models and use of other Town spaces should continue;
  - d. There should be a report to the Committee as a whole at least once per month;
