## TOWN ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:

Mr. Phelan reported that:

- Complaints are still being received about the peacocks in the vicinity of Canterbury Crossing on South Franklin Street. Although the Animal Control Officer has been trying to provide assistance to the residents, wild animals on private property are not the responsibility of the Town.
- O The town has been contacted by a citizen group about a potential development on the Abington/Holbrook line. The developer would like to dispose of excess property located in Holbrook, and the citizen group believes the land should be conservation land. Mr. Phelan will find out more information, including the value of the property. There could be tax consequences. The property is located close to the Holbrook Sportsmen's Club on Quincy

- Street, is landlocked, and there are wetland issues. The town could consider accepting it as a gift, if offered.
- o Mr. Gordon and Mr. Phelan have begun exploring a school regionalization partnership or tuitioning out Holbrook's students with neighboring towns, including Abington, Braintree, and Avon. There may be money available for a regionalization plan with funding from the Mass. School Building Authority (MSBA), and Rep. Ronald Mariano is researching it. There should be some answers by the fall. The School Department has retained Mr. Mark Abrahams of the Abrahams Group.
- Mr. Phelan has been in contact with Councilor Brewer in Randolph and Mayor Sullivan in Braintree regarding the future of the town's water. A Tri Town Water meeting will be scheduled. Mr. Phelan recommends that an engineering firm perform an analysis of the three possibilities the town has in terms of the cost. In meeting with Brockton, there are still many questions to be answered. Mr. Phelan will continue to work with Braintree and Randolph to get the percentages and shared cost of a Tri Town plant settled. Mr. Gordon explained that there would be overhead, plus the cost of the water, if the town buys water from Aquaria Water.
- o The annual Consumer Confidence Report on the public water supply is available at the Public Works Department office.

Mr. Cummings said that eight temporary employees were hired for the summer. They have been doing line painting in the streets and the brush painting of fences. The Chairman asked that someone be assigned to pick up the trash along the streets.

HEARING ON THE APPLICATION OF SOUTH SHORE POKER CLUB, INC. (PAUL A. ANASTASIO, MANAGER) FOR A GENERAL ON PREMISE LICENSE FOR WINE AND MALT BEVERAGES AT 27 MAPLE AVE., 4R:

Mr. McGaughey recused himself and left the room.

7:20 pm: The Chairman read the hearing notice, which was published in the *Holbrook Sun* on Friday, June 24, 2011.

Mr. Paul Anastasio explained that there have been 30 days of one-day alcohol licenses issued by the Board this year with no incidents, but that type of license is limited to 30 calendar days per year. In order to market the Poker Club as a function hall, they will need to be issued a permanent license. When asked if this was a change of use, Mr. Anastasio said it is not, and that he indicated in the application that it is a function hall. He said that everything new in the space is handicap accessible. Mr. Phelan explained that the Architectural Access Board ruled that the Poker Club does not constitute a change in use from the dance studio that was previously located in the space. Mr. Phelan referred to Article II of the Articles of Organization for South Shore Poker Club, Inc. and read that it states that they are a poker club, which "will solely operate as a charitable organization for fund raising purposes". He noted that the application states that "The purpose of the club is to host local non-profits and charitable organizations for charity poker night to raise monies for their foundations." The applicants said that it has been labled as a function hall and rented for charity poker all along, but they will have to determine what they can host going forward.

The Chairman indicated that there have been issues with running the operation as a poker club, and Mr. Paul Anastasio said that it is difficult for many individuals to be hands on. Mr. Gordon explained that the law cannot be circumvented, and his understanding is now that Mr. Anastasio is looking for a beer and wine license for an undefined purpose. It was explained that the Police Chief is allowing the organization to hold the events for those charities that have already been approved and have permits, but no new permits will be signed. Mr. Moore advised that the Anastasios redefine their business model and apply when they are ready. Mr. Mark Anastasio insisted that it is defined as a function hall. Chief O'Brien said the building does have a sprinkler system, but there has been an issue with the landlord testing the system, and there are issues with the building through Code enforcement. Chief Marble said there have been police details there with no problems. Although Mr. Anastasio has been cooperative, the Chief said they have not seen "eye to eye" on the interpretation of the law, and he is not comfortable with signing any more permits for poker.

Chairman Gordon explained that the applicant has to define the purpose of the business, whether it is a poker club, function hall, for profit or non-profit. Following discussion with the Anastasios, Mr. Mark Anastasio said that they will figure out their mission statement and present another application. He indicated that they were withdrawing their application at this time.

In answer to a question about establishing the value of a property to be sold, Mr. Digirolamo indicated he would be using attorneys for that purpose. The Board asked that the Treasurer/Collector come up with a formal policy on the sale of tax title properties by the August 9<sup>th</sup> Selectmen's meeting. Mr. Phelan discussed the options of the town rehabbing certain properties using funding from Community Development for the purpose of selling them to first time homebuyers through a lottery. Or, the town could sell the properties through an auction, requiring that the outstanding taxes be paid. Community Development money could only be used for a first time homebuyer program. It cannot be used to sell a property otherwise.

The COPELAND FAMILY FOUNDATION has had a longstanding tradition of making an annual monetary donation for the town's Animal Shelter.

- o Mass. Dept. of Transportation (DOT) has approved the work on Route 139.
- o On Weymouth Street at the intersection with Pine and Sycamore, the new beacons will be 12-inch ones.
- o The traffic signalization at the Public Safety Building will be moving forward during August.
- o The Public Works Department will be doing some excavating and preparing an area for parking at the Public Safety Building, but will not be doing the paving.
- o The town did not score well on an SRF application for the Phase 5 Sewer project. The project has been designed, but the land takings have not been done. There is one more phase, Phase 6.

- o Mr. Cummings will find out if Mr. Andrews will pay for the replacement of the lamp post in the square that was damaged in an accident.
- o Mr. Cummings said the infield at the Sean Joyce Field needs to be raised. The tractor sinks in after a rain. Mr. McGaughey said the Joyce Foundation purchased the pipe, and Mr. Daniel Moriarty, the Building Inspector, is giving the as-built plans to Mr. Al Kerr.
