# Minutes of the Regular Session of

Wednesday, June 26, 2013

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Chairman Gordon, in the Selectmen's Meeting Room, Holbrook Town Hall, 1<sup>st</sup> Floor, 50 North Franklin Street, Holbrook, MA 02343, and began with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Gordon recognized and congratulated Seaman Recruit JOSEPH MCKINNON, a member of the Fire Department, who is graduating from basic training on July 3, 2013, and is being honored by the Department of the Navy.

It was announced that the CONSUMER CONFIDENCE REPORT (CCR), containing water quality information for 2012, is available on the town's website, or in the offices of the Public Works Department or Town Clerk.

Mr. Richard Savary, the new owner of PINE HILL SERVICE STATION, INC., was present with his attorney, William Pritchard, Esq. Mr. Savary explained that Mr. Chester West left the business to him upon his passing. Mr. Savary has worked at Pine Hill for 25 years, and has been involved in running the business for two years. He asked that Mr. West's name be removed from the license, that Mr. Savary's name be added, and that the P & C Realty Trust, the owners of the property where the business is located, be removed from the license.

Mr. Timothy Stinson, who is a civil engineer assisting the HISTORICAL COMMISSION, was present with members of the Commission: Edna Bowers, Chairperson; Ms. Carol McDonald; and Ms. Sara Stinson. Mr. Stinson presented a packet of information on the Discussion Points on the French House. Mr. Stinson explained that he is not an architect, but is presenting information on the property at 21 NORTH FRANKLIN on behalf of the Historical Commission and Society. The property is an historic property, for sale, and in danger of being torn down to make way for a parking lot. The house was described as the French house, built about 1850. It is prominently sited in Holbrook Square, and is a pedimented Greek Revival house, which formerly served as the law office of Andrew Card, Esq., and the real estate office of his wife, Mrs. Joyce Card. The Historical Commission has suggested that it could be used for storage or an office for the Historical Commission, for Public Library

Mr. Stinson recommended that an architect or engineer should be engaged to perform a preliminary investigation and come up with factual costs and recommendations about renovating the property for town use. It was estimated that this could be accomplished for \$10,000 or less. If the Board wishes to proceed after receiving that report, town meeting would be asked to fund the services of a firm that would perform an intensive investigation. Then, town meeting would consider the facts and the rehabilitation of the building, and final plans would be drawn up.

Mr. Gordon asked that the cost of an assessment be determined so that the information could be brought before the Finance Committee. Mr. Gordon will contact Mr. George O'Neil for his input.

RECREATION Director Joan Brown explained that the Sumner Field gets a lot of use in the area of the walking track. She is arranging an exercise boot camp, where residents can meet at 6:00 am and exercise together. She is before the Board requesting support for the installation of two pieces of exercise equipment. The pieces would be permanently installed, are metal looking and have few moveable parts. They will be set up spread apart across the field on the left side, closer to Norfolk Road. The \$3,605.00 cost will be paid from the Recreation Commission's budget. The Board indicated it supports the idea.

Complaints have been received by both the Police Department and the Selectmen's office relative to the door-to-door sales conducted by JUST ENERGY. The Police Department provided copies of the logged entries of the calls they have received. Just Energy was contacted and invited to this meeting. After indicating that they would attend, they called back and asked that it be taken off the agenda because they were voluntarily ceasing soliciting in Holbrook. The Board explained that Just Energy has not been complying with the regulations that were set when the permit to solicit was issued, and have been accused of misrepresenting themselves.

Town Treasurer/Collector Paul Digirolamo will prepare a list of TAX TITLE and FORECLOSURE properties for the next meeting. Mr. Digirolamo explained that his office has been bogged down with vacations, and the staff is still being trained. Procedures are being put in place to catch terminations from health insurance and produce accurate reporting. Mr. Moore asked about bringing the CASH RECONCILIATIONS up to date with the Town Accountant and the possibility of using temporary help in the Treasurer's office. Currently, the Assistant Treasurer does the payroll. Mr. Phelan said that new integrated software is being considered that will allow each department to enter its own payroll information, instead of having the Treasurer's office do it.

Mr. Phelan reported that bid packages have been taken by contractors for ROAD WORK, and they are due back in two weeks. An award has been made for WATER MAIN REPLACEMENT. The design of the SEWER WORK is almost complete, and it is anticipated that it will be out to bid in three weeks. There has not been a lot of progress on the work at the SUMNER FIELD. Mr. Ecord will be consulted for an update on the status of the project. Mr. Gordon requested that a full-size BIN be pulled straight into the woods for storage.

Mr. Moore asked that the Public Works Department apply a fresh coat of paint to the barriers on CENTRE STREET near the trash company.

Police Chief William D. Marble, Jr., requested that the Board appoint a LIAISON FOR CIVIL SERVICE. They would be able to access information in the computer system relative to applications and Civil Service lists on behalf of the town.
