Mr. Gordon reported that:

- o A complaint was received about the traffic flow through the Grove section, particularly at Ell and Overlook Roads. The Police have monitored the situation and reported that no cars were observed speeding. Signs have gone up in the area.
- o Mr. Bob Gibbs, a consultant on smart growth, attended a meeting recently at the Town Hall, with members of the Economic Development Advisory Committee in attendance. A new master plan will need to be created, along with the rezoning of the Town.
- o The Planning Board is discussing a project under at 181 So. Franklin St., under the new Overlay **District Zoning**
- o The Town Accountant is working on the year end close
- The Town is still under Phase 4 of the water restrictions no outside use of water

Police Chief William Smith introduced a resident, MELISSA DEPILLO, who was being recognized because she came upon a stranger who had overdosed with children in his vehicle, and began CPR while the ambulance was on route. The Chief credited her with saving the father of four children. Ms. Depillo was presented with a citation from the Board of Selectmen.

Mr. Wayne Darragh, the Town's consultant on Community Development Block Grants, from Community Opportunities Group, Inc., was present. Mr. Darragh explained that the application for a Holbrook Board of Selectmen Minutes of the Regular Session Of September 28, 2016

CDBG grant for housing rehabilitation and fuel assistance, jointly with the Town of Rockland, was recently approved in the total amount of \$710,496, including \$586,334 for Housing Rehabilitation and \$70,000 for fuel assistance. Applications will be received, and a lottery will determine the order in which the projects are done. Community Opportunities Group, Inc., the only respondent to an RFP for the consultant services, submitted an agreement for the administration of the grant.

Three applicants responded to the posting for a WIRING INSPECTOR, a part-time position. Mr. Jason Churchey, Mr. David Keenan, and Mr. Gerald Graham, all residents of Holbrook, introduced themselves and spoke briefly about their experience. Mr. Gordon will interview the candidates and make a recommendation to the Board at the next meeting.

Mr. Phil Silverman, representing Massmedicum, explained that he is before the Board of Selectmen requesting a letter of non-opposition for a medical marijuana distribution facility at 1 Mear Road. He explained the security and limited access at the facility, and the benefits the Town would derive from hosting the facility. Mr. Silverman said that Massmedicum is trying to obtain a license from the state, which requires that they get a letter of non-opposition. However, they prefer not to dispense in Holbrook, and are looking at alternative locations. Members of Holbrook Cares spoke asking that the Town not provide the letter this evening, but wait until after the November election and the recreational marijuana ballot question, and until the Town is educated on what the ballot question will allow if

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passed. Discussion took place about creating a zoning district in order to limit where marijuana facilities can be located, since the location cannot be controlled right now. Those speaking were concerned about medical marijuana facilities becoming recreational facilities if the law passes. Board members considered delaying the vote.

delegation and have a better understanding

Chief Smith reported that the department arrested a person who had been breaking into houses. The department will be participating in training. A new cruiser is expected soon.

Mr. Ecord reported that the department has been working on repairs to the Lake Holbrook Dam. A paving company will be starting the re-paving of the streets that had water projects done last year. The PWD is working on sidewalk repair and pot holes.

Chief McFadden said that the Fire Dept.'s open house is October 8th.

Director Hooke advised that the department has a consultant to do a cost analysis of the income, revenues and expenses of the department. They will be getting the next generation of 911 equipment to replace all of the current equipment. Everything will be electronic, including the internet, texts, pictures and video.

A representative of Senator Keenan's office was present, and will do some marijuana research to advise how the legislation is structured.
