Announcement:

The Town Forest Committee has scheduled guided walks in the TOWN FOREST, beginning at 1:00 p.m. on the Saturdays of January 14, February 11 and March 11, 2017.

Town Administrator Timothy Gordon reported that:

- A meeting was held with Atty. Mark Bobrowski relative to the upcoming re-zoning of the Town, and the process should move right along.
- The next agenda will include a discussion on the purchase of the street lighting from NGRID. The Town would then change over to LED lighting.

- There is a meeting on February 1 with the Town's tax title attorney and Town Counsel about the options to resolve the Edgewood Park properties.
- There will be an auction of foreclosed Town properties late winter/early spring
- The Town Forest Committee is going to the Conservation Commission about a foreclosed property adjacent to the Town Forest. The property is landlocked, with trails already going through it.
- A Salary Administration hearing will be set up for the next agenda on January 25th.
- Pricing and recommendations are being gathered relative to a PA system for the Selectman Noel King meeting room.

Wayne Darragh, Vice-President, COMMUNITY OPPORTUNITIES GROUP, INC., explained the two requests for approval before the Board. The Dept. of Housing and Community Development contacted Mr. Darragh to begin closing out the FY2005 housing rehabilitation grant. Therefore, bookkeeping adjustments need to be made to reallocate some funds through a budget amendment. Amendment #1 of the contract with Community Opportunities Group, Inc. reallocates the remaining \$20,000.00 to a new milestone to close out the grant.

- MOTION: By Mr. Moriarty, second by Mr. Lee, that the Board of Selectmen authorize the Chairman to execute the FY2005 CDBG grant budget amendment, which includes reallocating \$1,803.35 from the construction line item (4C) to the general administration line item (9) and reducing the construction line item (4C) by \$38,675.65, in order to balance the accounts under the grant and begin the closeout of the grant
 VOTE: 4:0
- MOTION: By Mr. Moriarty, second by Mr. Lee, that the Board of Selectmen authorize the Chairman to execute Amendment 1 to the Agreement By and Between the Town of Holbrook and Community Opportunities Group, Inc. in order to adjust the contract fees for the Consultant's administration of four (4) housing rehabilitation units, with the compensation to remain the same, but be allocated to new milestones

Veterans' Agent Leo Fuller discussed a proposal for holding a POW/MIA CHAIR OF HONOR ceremony in Mary Wales Holbrook Park on Saturday, June 10, 2017 and permanently displaying the chair in the foyer of the Town Hall. The flags, velvet ropes, stanchions, and plaque will be donated. An anonymous donor has come forward to pay for the cost of a chair to be purchased.

Cynthia Brennan, the Interim Coordinator for the COUNCIL ON AGING, explained how busy the COA is responding to calls and emails from seniors and outside companies and agencies. There are 2,600 senior voters in Holbrook. She requested that the Board approve hiring someone temporarily to fill-in for the Interim Coordinator when she cannot be there. Also, an alternate, on-call, van driver is needed to fill in when one of the regular drivers is unable to drive for scheduled senior appointments or outings. The salary of the part-time Interim Coordinator needs to be established. The Salary Administration Wage Plan indicated the Coordinator should receive \$22.00/hr. in FY2017.

Under the Salary Administration Wage Plan, the COA Driver is paid \$13.67/hr. for FY2017.

The hearing notice for the 7:30 pm PUBLIC HEARING being held to discuss the RENOVATION OF A PORTION OF SOUTH FRANKLIN STREET and hear public comments, was posted with the Town Clerk and on the Town's website, emailed from the Town's website to all those who have signed up to receive Town notices, and was read aloud. This meeting was broadcast live on the Community Access Channels on cable television. Present, in addition to those listed above: Conrad Leger of BETA Group, Inc., and several Holbrook residents.

 MOTION: By Mr. Moore, second by Mr. Moriarty, to open the public hearing on the proposed South Franklin Street Renovation Project
 VOTE: 4:0

Mr. Leger explained that the renovation of South Franklin Street (Route 37), from south of Snell Street to south of King Road, is a potential Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) project, which would improve the roadway and infrastructure. He reviewed the process for getting a project on the TIP, and noted that the Town is responsible for the design of the project. The Town is currently at Step 4 in the TIP process, which includes Public Outreach and the Project Initiation Form. A copy of a letter from MassDOT, indicating acceptance of the Project Needs Form, was handed out. Project Fact Sheets, prepared by BETA Group, Inc., were distributed to those present and Mr. Leger displayed and explained large aerial pictures depicting the area of the proposed project.

It was discussed that Route 37 serves as the Town's main street, where several public buildings, including the Fire and Police Departments, and numerous commercial buildings are located, and a new PreK – Grade 12 public school is expected to open in September 2017. The roadway is in need of improvements, and the sidewalks, curbing and accessibility need improvement to support the pedestrian traffic in the area. It was discussed that the traffic signals at King Road, adjacent to the Public Safety Building, are in need of improvement. In view of the new mixed-use overlay zoning recently passed for this area, it was suggested that the Town look at incorporating parallel parking to accommodate the new zoning, and support an increase in commercial properties. It was noted that this project could be 10 years away, if it is approved. Mr. Leger explained the importance of getting the project to the first design phase, at 25% design. The Town will find out if the project is accepted for the TIP after a regional meeting in February.

The Board reviewed an agreement with BETA Group, Inc. for services related to a PAVEMENT RE-INSPECTION PROGRAM. Mr. Gordon explained that this agreement will include identifying the status of water and sewer projects also. There was a request that the condition of the sidewalks also be noted.

MOTION: By Mr. Moore, second by Mr. McGaughey, that the Board of Selectmen authorize the Chairman to execute an Agreement Between the Town of Holbrook and BETA Group, Inc. for Pavement Re-Inspection Services related to the Town's Pavement Management Program, for a contract amount not to exceed \$9,250.00

Mr. Gordon explained that there were 13 applicants for the position of 28 hr. part-time Principal Clerk for Inspectional Services (21 hrs.) and the Town Clerk's office (7 hrs.). The applicants were narrowed down to two finalists – Joan Glass and Deborah Joyce. Mr. Gordon and Mr. Arthur Boyle submitted the two names to the Board for a final decision.

Two common victualler licensees completed their renewal applications prior to December 31st, but not in time for the Board to vote on the renewals during December. Therefore, they are considered at the first meeting in January.

Department Head Updates:

Fire Chief McFadden: One injured Firefighter has returned to work. There have been many accidents and one small fire in an apartment at 28 Weymouth Street. Open burning begins January 15th. Treasurer/Collector Digirolamo: Reported on tax title collections, and explained the quarterly real estate tax billing. The Town took 2 properties with houses and there are a couple of evictions.

Supt. Ecord: There have been small ice events. A sewer pump station needed a new pump. The PWD is filling pot holes.

Police Chief Smith: Holbrook participated in a huge drug raid with the South Shore Task Force. More people who need help have been sent for treatment.

Director Hooke: Canton Fire is moving forward, and equipment is being installed. Dispatching Canton should begin by July. He has been contacted by two more towns, but there is no more room in the current facility. He advised that there is going to be an increase in grant funding for expansions from the 911 Commission, and asked that the Board think about expanding the Communications Department to allow more towns to join Holbrook.

Town Accountant Moseley: She has been working on the conversion of the financial software. She recommends that the Board consider changing auditors in order to get a new perspective. The Board indicated approval of the idea.
