#### It was announced that:

- Fire History Day will be celebrated by the Fire Department and the Historical Society at the Roberts School on April 29, 2017
- The Historical Society will present "Sacco-Vanzetti Revisited" at the Town Hall on Sunday, May 7, 2017
- There will be a Yard Waste Curbside Collection on Saturday, May 13, 2017
- The Norfolk County Registry of Deeds will hold office hours at the Town Hall on May 18, 2017
- There is a vacancy for an Associate Member of the Planning Board

## Town Administrator Gordon reported that:

- There is a "Last Chance" walk thru of Holbrook Junior-Senior High School on Sunday, April 30, 2017. The school will be demolished after June 15<sup>th</sup> in preparation for the opening of the new PreK 12 school.
- Voting on the purchase of the streetlights is being delayed, due to an issue with the insurance. There are 969 overhead lights, 57 from underground, and 5 wood poles with lights, but no other utility, at a cost of \$103,000. Using Braintree Electric Light Department (BELD) for the maintenance will give Holbrook a savings of 50% with the LEDs.
- The tax title property auction is scheduled for May 17, 2017.
- BETA Engineering will be doing an updated street survey within the next week.

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- The Public Works Department has created a water project aging report.
- Masonry work is going to be done on the northeast corner of the Town Hall.
- The School Committee will be meeting at the Town Hall until the new school opens in the fall.

Dave Dingledy, Chairman of the SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE was present and recommended the appointment of Mr. William Kirtz to the Committee. Mr. Kirtz was present and was introduced.

Conservation Commission members, Timothy Stinson, Chairman, and William Forte were present about an ongoing issue at 2 PHILLIPS ROAD. Mr. Forte explained that there have been conservation issues for nearly two years since the property was developed without a permit in a riverfront area. Since the owner has been unresponsive, the Conservation Commission voted to place \$300 per day fines on the property, and are now before the Selectmen for approval. A 3-day process will be followed, including a warning, \$200 fine, then \$300 per day. The placement of the fines can be appealed.

Holbrook 115-kV Reliability Project

This hearing is about a grant of location petition to install a third 115-kV line within the existing right-of-way on existing line towers, crossing Centre St., Scott St., Westdale Rd., Damon Ave., Pine St., and N. Franklin St. (MassDOT jurisdiction).

Atty. North said she received the plans and made the recommended modifications to the order. Mr. Lopes agreed that Eversource will reinstall a Cranberry Pond Conservation Area sign that was removed, was left on the property, and should be reinstalled.

NSTAR Electric dba Eversource to locate and construct a single line, with four (4) component parts, and the necessary wires and cables therein, for five (5) crossings of the following streets: Centre Street; Scott Street; Westdale Road; Damon Avenue; and Pine Street, located substantially as shown on the plans dated October 20, 2016 (Sheets 1-7),

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which were filed with the petition, and sign the requested Order and Certificate, as

revised and updated by counsel

Mr. Gordon explained that the approximately 32 acre parcel of land at 320R WEYMOUTH STREET, which is owned by the Town, was acquired through the tax title process. It is the opinion of Town Counsel that tax title foreclosed property is the Treasurer's responsibility. However, if there is going to be a building built by a developer, if the property is auctioned off, the building is a decision of the Selectmen, not the Treasurer. Mr. Digirolamo explained that the intention is to designate 26.2 acres of the property as open space/conservation land. If the abutter who is interested in the property is the successful bidder, he is willing to build a parking area on lower property to provide access. The Board discussed whether to require a building to be built as a condition of the sale of the property. If there were a building built, the utilities and maintenance would be the Town's responsibility. Board members indicated that the Town should try to get the most money for the property, and not require a big building.

MOTION: By Mr. Moriarty, second by Mr. Sheehan, that the Board of Selectmen add a stipulation

on the sale of 320R Weymouth Street, that a parking lot and small shed type building be

built for the use of the Town Forest Committee for their tools and equipment

Supt. Ecord explained that the water main project on CRESCENT DRIVE was approved for emergency procurement by the Massachusetts Division of Capital Asset Management and Maintenance (DCAMM).

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MOTION: By Mr. Lee, second by Mr. Moriarty, that the Board of Selectmen vote to authorize Celco

Construction Corporation to complete the Water Main Replacement Project on Crescent

Drive, at the estimated cost of \$109,700.00, as per the proposal submitted

Chief McFadden explained that the Fire Department was given a \$140,000.00 Assistance to Firefighters Grant award that, with a \$6,607.00 match from the Town, will pay for the purchase of Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) for the Fire Department.

MOTION: By Mr. Lee, second by Mr. Moriarty, that the Board of Selectmen approve the purchase

of Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus and related equipment, pursuant to the 2015 Assistance to Firefighters Grant that was accepted at the Board of Selectmen's meeting on July 13, 2016, and authorize the Fire Chief to complete the procurement through the Massachusetts COMMBUYS system and execute any other related documents on behalf

of the Town of Holbrook Fire Department

Chief Smith, Chief McFadden, Director Hooke, Supt. Ecord, and Treasurer/Collector Digirolamo provided updates on their respective departments. The County has hired a helicopter company to drop pellets to control the mosquitos. The Dispatchers will soon be taking wireless 911 calls directly. At the request of Director Hooke, the Board indicated support for State 911 funding for one full-time additional person, including salary and benefits. May 1<sup>st</sup> is real estate tax day.
