The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Chairman Lee, in the Selectman Noel C. King Meeting Room, Holbrook Town Hall, Floor 3R, 50 North Franklin Street, Holbrook, MA 02343, and opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

The SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC WORKS position has been posted. Eleven applications have been received so far, and the deadline is December 29<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Gordon recommended that a 3-person committee be formed to review the resumes. Town Administrator Gordon and Selectman Kevin Sheehan will serve in that capacity. Chief Smith may be the third person, who will be chosen by Mr. Gordon.

Police Chief Smith introduced ERIN MCEACHEN, who was recently given a conditional offer as a Holbrook Police Officer. She will be starting the academy in February. The Chief will bring another candidate before the Board at the next meeting.

Police Officer Michael Eshner presented an update on his new position as the COMMUNITY OUTREACH OFFICER for the Department. This program is designed to create a partnership with the community, address quality of life issues, and network with other communities. A neighborhood watch program similar to NextDoor.com will be established. Officer Eshner is working with Holbrook Cares and the District Attorney's office to address opiod and other addiction issues. In the future, there will be an education seminar for parents, and a junior police academy for students in about the 6<sup>th</sup> grade. Mr. McGaughey suggested that officers walk and interact with residents as part of the program.

Chief Smith reported that the Department is continuing work toward certification. There are 159 standards to meet and more standards to become accredited.

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The Tri Town Water Board has received three proposals for an Owner's Project Manager for the new water treatment plant. They have asked that each of the three towns appoint someone to review the proposals. Mr. Gordon suggested that Daniel Moriarty, Jr. be appointed.

Environmental Partners Group, Inc. will be providing the engineering services for the Lake Holbrook Dam Replacement project. A grant has been received that will cover 75% of the cost of the engineering. The total cost of the complete project is estimated at \$1 million. Another grant application will be filed for the construction phase.

Holbrook Dam Replacement, for an amount not to exceed \$277,000.00
