The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Chairman Lee in the Selectman Noel C. King Meeting Room, Holbrook Town Hall, Floor 3R, 50 North Franklin Street, Holbrook, MA 02343, and began with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Gordon announced that:

- The Holbrook Cultural Council is looking for new members
- The Norfolk County Registry of Deeds will be at the Town Hall on Thursday, May 16th, in order to provide services at the local level in Holbrook

JOINT WATER TREATMENT PLANT – EMERGENCY DECLARATION:

It was explained that there was a major power failure at Randolph/Holbrook Water Treatment Plant on Saturday that damaged a major pump. The MWRA and MEMA reached out, and a temporary pump was installed. Residents may notice reduced water pressure. The plant will be shut down on the night of the 26th while rental equipment is being installed. It was stressed that this is not a water quality issue – it is a distribution issue. Residents were asked to conserve water.

It has been determined that the treatment plant needs immediate, substantial work in order to keep functioning sufficiently. The Department of Revenue has been consulted and recommended that the Town follow the process of declaring a local emergency, in order to request authorization to deficit spend for the necessary repairs. The first step is a vote of the Board of Selectmen:

Emergency, under the provisions of MGL Chapter 44, Section 31, in order to authorize Town Departments to incur liability in excess of appropriation, for the purpose of repairs

to the Randolph/Holbrook Joint Water Treatment Plant

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Public Works Superintendent Chris Pellitteri was thanked for his work over this past weekend at the Randolph/Holbrook Water Treatment Plant.

Mr. Gordon explained that the Board needs to take one vote on the Wage and Salary Schedule that is going before town meeting on May 7, 2019. It was previously voted to provide 2% increases in wages for a few positions that will need the maximum wage column adjusted to accommodate the 2% raise.

Laborer Part-Time from \$23.00 to \$23.46

Mr. Gordon also reported that:

- Town meeting preparations continue, and preparations for Memorial Day will follow
- He recommended that the two responses to the South School RFP be reviewed by the Board at meetings on different nights
- The repointing of bricks, painting of the exterior and other renovations are continuing at the Town Hall, using earmark funding
- A new website for the Town Hall Departments is being worked on

SWEARING IN OF TOWN'S FIRST DEPUTY POLICE CHIEF & A SERGEANT:

Chief Smith introduced William D. Marble, Jr., who was promoted from the rank of Sergeant to the rank of DEPUTY POLICE CHIEF on April 10, 2019. Town Clerk Jeanmarie Tarara was present and swore Deputy Police Chief Marble in.

Chief Smith introduced Daniel Ford, who was promoted from the rank of Police Officer to the rank of SERGEANT on April 10, 2019. Town Clerk Jeanmarie Tarara was present and swore Sergeant Daniel Ford in.

Chief Smith reported that a contract has been signed with MEMA for reimbursement of expenses related to the March 2nd storm. The Police cruiser that caught fire has been totaled.

The Deputy Police Chief's position is a non-union position. The Board of Selectmen has negotiated a personal agreement with the Deputy Chief.

EXIT INTERVIEW - FY2018 TOWN AUDIT:

Present: Ms. Renee Davis and Mr. Kyle Warne, representing Powers & Sullivan, LLC

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Ms. Davis explained that the Board had before them a report on the Town's financial statements, a report on the Town's federal grants, and a report on how the Town could strength its internal controls and improve efficiency. She reviewed the components of the Financial Statements, and said that the Town has strong controls over the budget. Some of the deficiencies previously reported in the Management Letter have been resolved or partially resolved, and some others could be strengthened, but no significant deficiencies were found. Two new areas that could be strengthened include the School Department and the Town Clerk's office.

Treasurer/Collector Paul Digirolamo advised that he will be back before the Board at an upcoming meeting in May for a vote on the sale of BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES (BAN) totaling \$6,780.000. The total includes \$5,570,000 for the new School Project, \$860,000 for the traffic signal project at Weymouth, Pine and Sycamore Streets, and \$700,000 for the water meter replacement project. There is still approximately \$4.9 million due from the state on the new school project.

Mr. Digirolamo reported that he is still short-handed in his office.

Director Hooke said employees have taken part in 2-day training on burnout and how to deal with difficult people, which was paid for by a 911 grant. Residents were encouraged to sign up to receive Reverse 911 Code Red Calls. The information is published on the Communications Department's Facebook page, on the Police Department's website, and on the Town's website.

Chief McFadden reported that the Department has been busy with routine calls and inspections. Open burning ends on May 1st.

Chief Smith said residents can deposit unwanted prescription and non-prescription drugs in the container in the lobby of the Public Safety Building for National Take Back Day until noon on Saturday.
