

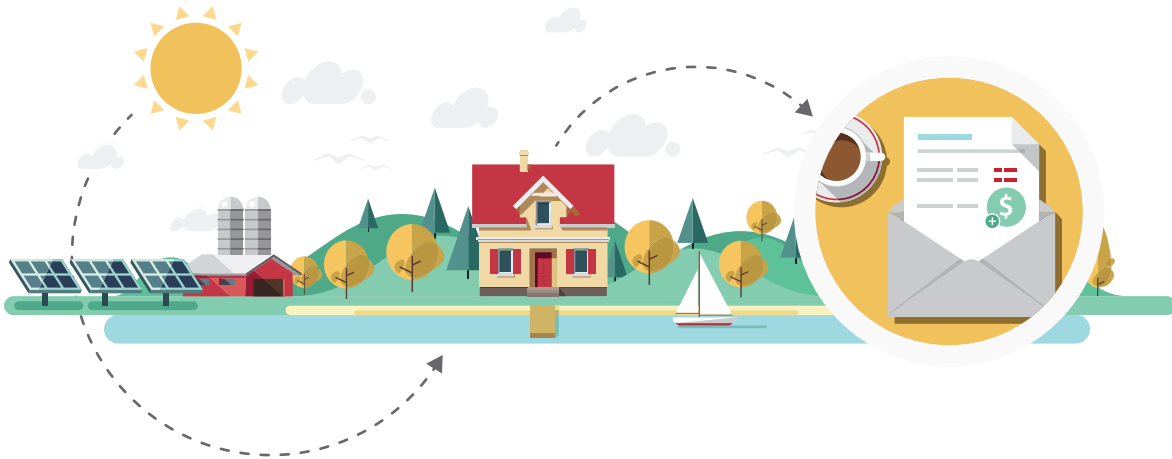


## Solarize My Bill Community Solar Program

### What is Community Solar?

Community Solar, sometimes referred to as "shared solar" or "solar farms," allows participants to realize the benefits of solar without installing anything on their property.



Nexamp Community Solar projects generate clean, renewable electricity that feeds into the utility grid.

Through virtual net metering, you receive credit for your share of the solar electricity generated by the project.

The value of the electricity produced each month appears as dollar credits on your utility bill. *It's that easy!*

# Frequently Asked Questions

## Am I eligible?

If you live in Massachusetts and pay a National Grid, Unitil, or Eversource electric bill, you are eligible to participate. Our program is open to anyone - households, renters, condos, businesses, and nonprofits - so please contact us to check for availability at a community solar project serving your area.

## Do I have to install solar panels or equipment on my property?

No. You are subscribing to a remote community solar project. You receive credit for your share of the solar project, but there is no installation of **anything** on your property.

## What will my utility bill look like?

Once the project is feeding electricity into the utility grid, you will see a line item on your regular utility bill labeled "Transfer Credits/Charges." These are the solar net metering credits from your share of the project and they are automatically applied as payment toward your monthly electricity costs.

## How do I see my savings?

Nexamp's community solar projects generate credits throughout the year and each participant will earn enough credits to cover nearly all of their annual electricity costs. For each \$1.00 credit transferred to your bill, Nexamp will charge you only \$0.85 - **a guaranteed 15% discount**. You will earn more credits during the spring and summer months, when solar production peaks, and you will draw on these excess credits during the fall and winter months, when production is lower.

## How much does it cost to sign up?

There are no costs to enroll and no additional service fees associated with your participation.

## What is my level of commitment?

You can receive savings for up to 20 years. However, you always have the option to change your solar allocation or to cancel with no penalty. The utility accepts changes only twice a year, so your allocation change/cancel request may take up to 6 months to go into effect.

## Does this change my relationship with the utility?

Not at all; the utility delivers electricity to your home as usual, and will continue to service all equipment and resolve all power outages. Nexamp will handle all communication with your utility regarding your enrollment in community solar.

## What if I buy electricity from a different supplier?

If you pay a discounted electricity supply rate through a third-party supplier, you can still participate in community solar. Solar net metering credits can offset any costs that appear on your utility bill, including the utility delivery fees plus the electricity charges from another supplier.

## How do I get started?
