BUDGET COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES Town Hall 35 Main Street Thursday, November 19, 2009

CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Pieroni called the meeting to order at 6:35 pm.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

October 22, 2009

J. Danforth motioned to approve the minutes as presented. Seconded by K. Hughes as amended

Vote unanimously in favor.

School Budget - sent electronically to all members

D. Argo: As a result of the School Board budget review with the Administration, the final number is \$26,00721.84, which is \$76,000 below default. That represents a 2.5% increase over last year's plan. The drivers are over a million dollars in uncontrolled cost including a \$70,128. increase in retirement because the % of contribution has gone up. We budgeted \$8200 for High School tuition. They are telling us it will be \$8300 per student. Health insurance maximum (unknown till June) of 21.5% increase, which is \$439,651. The prediction is it will come in on the high side this year. Special Education cost for High School is a \$364,000 increase. That is a formula, which is reviewed by the department of education. This will be addressed on December 5th. 88% of the Special Ed increases go to the Manchester issue. The School Board cut \$31,678 from the Superintendent's budget.

The School Board would like to use the fund balance for 2009-2010 to purchase books.

The SB is currently negotiating the contract.

Question for next meeting

What would be the impact of a .5% increase to the teacher's contract?

What are the Special Education increases?

J. Hyde suggested a step type of payment for insurance based on salary level.

JR questioned whether the Evergreen clause is in effect this year.
