1. Is there any interest in making this a **Town Forest**?

Response: We haven't really considered it, but it is not entirely necessary because the Conservation Easement protects it. Also Town Forests have more conditions (i.e. must establish a Commission)

2. **Parking** on Chester Turnpike is a concern (there are parties there at night). This may provide more parking for them and for dumping and shooting range. Have the parking in Candia.

Response: Creating an official, known trail head may deter these activities. Head's Pond was a similar situation, but since creating the trails out there, it has cleaned up and those activities have ceased. We will discuss with Police and Fire. 3. **Mountain Biking** – connect to Bear Brook trails. Want single track trails (18 inches wide). Surrounding towns have these trails; Hooksett is the only one without mountain bike trails. Want to connect to other trails through Clay Pond.

Response: The current thought is just to enhance existing trails, but it is something to consider.

4. Parking – Won't more parking attract more ATVs and snowmobiles?

Response: The proposed access points will not provide easier access for snowmobiles than the parking on RTE 27 across from Dube's Pond. ATVs are restricted from the conservation area.

- 5. Chester Turnpike is a legal **ATV** trail in Hooksett. Parking will encourage more ATV use. Response: We need to research the legal status of Chester Turnpike further.
- 6. What changes will be made to **hunting**?

Response: None, hunting will still be an allowed, permanent use.

7. What types of **trails** will they be?

Response: Single track, wood trails. Not like Head's Pond.

8. I want to leave the **wildlife** alone. Recreation will endanger them and attract them out to residential areas.

Response: The proposed recreational activity is low impact Passive Recreation. This should not push wildlife to residential areas.

9. Forestry will negatively impact wildlife.

Response: The forestry activities in the draft plan are designed to enhance wildlife habitats.

10. Signage saying "Hike at your own risk" because of wildlife (bears, bobcats, foxes)

Response: We plan on posting the area similar to other passive recreation areas (e.g. Pinnacle Park)

- 11. Peninsula is pristine and should stay that way. Don't want any trail access to it.
- 12. Want more abutters' notices for any additional meetings.

Response: We will do that
