#### **HOOKSETT AIRPORT**

Built in 1944 by Carl S. Park Sr., the Hooksett-Manchester Airport, commonly known as Hooksett Airport, had a grass runway, a six-plane hangar, and a seaplane base on the Merrimack River.

Operating as Bayside Flying Service, Park was busy with student instruction, plane rental, charter flights, and maintenance services.

Many WW II veterans received pilot training under the G.I. Bill. Flight operations of the Hooksett Civil Air Patrol Squadron were based here.

Park began leasing the facilities to others in 1958. He sold the airport property to a developer in 1973.
