- The overall Goal of Hooksett league is to offer a fun and competitive baseball experience at an affordable cost to the families of Hooksett.
  - In the last two years HLL has expanded their baseball experience by offering free clinics, more exposure to tournaments and summer and fall baseball and now a U14 wooden bat team and U5 Blastball.
  - The response is great and enrollment into the league has increased the last two years.
  - We need to expand our facilities to support a better baseball experience.



# • Enrollment:

- 2009: 301 registered players
- 2010: 304 registered players
  - + 24 Blast Ball Player
  - + 14 U14 Players
  - 332 Total registered players
- Cost to play:
  - \$65 for one player per family
  - \$90 for two or more players per family

### Clinics

- Hooksett Little League offers a comprehensive clinic program in conjunction with Hooksett Based MVP/Frozen ropes)
- This program runs from March through June
- Frozen ropes has a dedicated professional baseball staff.
- Clinics at Frozen ropes are offered at a reduced fee
- Clinics at Donati field are free to players as HLL incurs all the costs.
- Outdoor free clinics are offered once a week. Indoor clinics at Frozen Ropes are offered daily.



## Fundraising:

- In order to keep costs down and allow free programs like the clinics HLL diligently fundraises.
  - Calendar Sales: \$5,950.00
  - Fifty-Fifty Raffle: \$401.00
  - Misc Donations: \$3,011.00
  - Golf Tournament: \$4,513.00
  - Registrations: \$15,205.00
  - Concessions: \$ 14,533.00
  - Sponsorships: \$11,590.00



# Support:

- The league has worked closely with Parks and Recreation and is very grateful for the support we've received.
  - Hooksett fields are in top shape and are some of the nicest fields in our LL district
- HLL also received a lot of great support building two fields at Memorial School. One for Softball (at the time part of HLL) and one for Baseball. The fields were possible through 100% volunteer and donations.



### Current Needs:

- Field Availability
  - HLL currently and traditionally is allowed on the fields on or around April 15<sup>th</sup>. Before this time we are regulated to indoor gym use which is shared by the schools, Softball, Basketball and Lacrosse

- Field Availability Continued: (All data from LL Presidents)
  - Competing and surrounding Leagues
    - Goffstown Outdoor Practices Start April 1<sup>st</sup>. Opening Day on or around May 1<sup>st</sup>
    - Manchester Central Outdoor Practices Start March 29<sup>th</sup> Opening Day on or around April 17<sup>th</sup>.
    - Manchester North Outdoor Practices Start End of March. This year March 15<sup>th</sup>. Opening Day April on or around April 17th.
    - Bedford Little League Outdoor Practices Start April 1<sup>st</sup>. Opening Day on or around May 1<sup>st</sup>.
    - Manchester East Outdoor Practices Start End First Week of April. Opening Day on or around April 24<sup>th</sup>.
    - Manchester South Outdoor Practices Start End On or before April 1<sup>st</sup>.
       Opening Day May on or around May 1<sup>st</sup>.
    - Auburn Little League Outdoor Practices Start first week of April. Opening day during last week of April.
  - Hooksett Little League Outdoor Practices start April 15th. Opening Day May 8<sup>th</sup>. Last year Outdoor Practice start April 14<sup>th</sup>. Opening Day May 9<sup>th</sup>.



### • Fields:

- What we would respectively request is that our fields be open to us April 1<sup>st</sup>.
  - Parks and Recreation would set this as the date for all work completed on fields.
  - The nature of baseball is low impact to grass surfaces with majority play on the infield dirt.
  - This would be a major step towards a more successful little league program.
  - It mirrors Goffstown and Bedford. Two of the states best programs. Two programs that have sent teams to the little league world series.



# Bullpens

- Another key element to the leagues success are bullpens. Hooksett is one a a very few without dedicated pitching bullpens.
  - · The lack of which hurts pitching development
  - It also keeps Hooksett from hosting tournaments
    - Tournaments bring revenue to a program and recognition to a town.
- HLL is willing to incur all the costs for installing bullpens.
  - We need a location and approval



# • Lights:

- HLL is working with HYAA to investigate lights for our fields.
  - HLL is also actively fundraising to this goal. This will increase playing time and more importantly practice time for our players
