Hooksett Sewer Commission March 2, 2010 Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 12:00 PM. Present were Chairman Sidney Baines, Commissioner Raymond Robb, Commissioner Roger Bergeron, Superintendent Bruce Kudrick and Bethany Hague.

APPROVE & SIGN MINUTES FROM FEBRUARY 16, 2010

Commissioner Bergeron made a motion to accept the February 16, 2010 meeting minutes as read. Chairman Baines seconded. All in favor, motion carried unanimously.

READ CORRESPONDENCE

FINANCIAL REPORT - There was no financial report.

SUPERTENDENT KUDRICK'S REPORT

DOT – Steven Swana contacted Supt. Kudrick regarding the K-Mart Generator and asked him if anything had been done. Supt. Kudrick told him that no, as the Sewer Commission has not received anything from DOT stating that any work to move the generator building would be paid for by the DOT. Mr. Swana asked that Supt. Kudrick contact RK Associates for the preliminaries, and Supt. Kudrick has sent a letter to RK Associates, but has not yet received a response.

POWER FAILURE – The plant lost power around 12:30 AM on 2/26. There were no major problems, but 2.4 million gallons went through the plant during the storm. The pump station at Golden Gate had to be pumped out by septic truck, but as they dumped the waste into a manhole on Castle Drive, the plant will only be charged for the use of the truck, not disposal fees.

MANCHESTER MANOR – Supt. Kudrick has been talking to Roger Burgess regarding TVing the lines of the mobile home park. He would like this done because in the two years prior, the Martins Ferry pump station took on a lot of water during the flooding. Mr. Burgess has made improvements to the property, namely addressing the overflowing brook to the back of the property. Martins Ferry took on much less water last week during the storm, and it seems that the problem has been with infiltration of stormwater from the park. Supt. Kudrick would like to get a better idea of other problem areas, and will work with Mr. Burgess about this problem.

FLOWS – The flows for January and February were down until the 25th and 26th of February. But there has been no violations for those months.

SCHEDULED APPOINTMENTS

There were no scheduled appointments.

OLD BUSINESS

HIGHWAY - Chairman Baines has spoken to Town Administrator Carol Granfield about the problem regarding where manholes are placed in new construction areas. She will talk with Dale Hemeon from the Highway Department and may set up a meeting to discuss the matter further.
