Currently, Ocean State Job Lots has located on the other side of the building. WP Realty just needed a letter stating that everything was set from the Sewer Department for submission to the planning board for the project. There was also discussion regarding the remaining 22,000 – 24,000 square feet left vacant in that building, that they would like to create an entirely new retail unit from. As there are only two units in the building now being used by Ocean State and the Tractor Supply, the \$3000 system development fee and \$100 permit fee would be required for the unit. They would also need to submit plans to the Superintendent for his review as to where facilities would be placed.
