M. Farrell thanked Finance Director Diane Savoie for all of her hard work since September working with the department heads on the budget. It has made his job a lot easier. He explained his budget memo to the Town Council included in the budget book dated December 27, 2000. The public does not see the problem with the default budget because they are still having their garbage picked up, their roads plowed and worked on, etc. They think since these type of things are still being done that we do not need the extra money. This year's budget is a bare minimum of what we need. We have had 139 Certificates of Occupancy this year alone.
