TOWN COUNCIL Regular Meeting Wednesday, January 26, 2011

CALL TO ORDER: Chair Gahara called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm.

PRESENT: David Boutin, James Gorton, Vincent Lembo, James Levesque, George Longfellow, Daniel Paradis, Michael Pischetola, Nancy VanScoy and Carol Granfield Town Administrator)

NON-PUBLIC SESSION

J. Levesque moved at 6:12 pm to enter into non-public session per RSA 91-A:3, II (c) "Matters which, if discussed in public, would likely affect adversely the reputation of any person, other than a member of the public body itself, unless such person requests an open meeting. This exemption shall extend to any application for assistance or tax abatement or waiver of a fee, fine, or other levy, if based on inability to pay or poverty of the applicant."

Motion seconded by J. Gorton. Roll call vote carried unanimously.

J. Levesque moved at 6:52 pm to exit the non-public session. Motion seconded by N. VanScoy. <u>Roll call</u> vote carried unanimously.

The Council made a statement that they voted to seal the minutes of the non-public session.

PUBLIC INPUT

M. Sorel, 54 Cross Road: I attended the Police Commission meeting last night and would like to report here as well. I read a letter to the editor which prompted me to go back to May 2009 when it became known that there would be public grievance hearings in the Month of May. I didn't know Officer Defina or the issues but attended the hearings. At the end of the second evening I formed an opinion based on and what I witnessed which was Officer Defina is not a good employee. I think he is a bad employee. In business, we call these employees malcontents. The Letter to the Editor two weeks ago cemented that opinion I made in 2009. Several years ago I took a course in personnel management and read a book by Eldbert Hubbard. In that book, I read, "If I work for a man, work for him......and never know the reason why" This relates to the letter written by Jay Defina in the Letter to the Editor. (Copy to recording secretary)

M. Miville, 42 Main Street: I also attended the Police Commission meeting. I want this Council to know that the same quote has been used by a Police Commissioner in at least one exit interview which I think is inappropriate to use on an exit interview. I also stated that like noses, everyone has an opinion. I state that Officer Defina has

a right to state his mind and has that right based on the Declaration of Independence. Officer Defina is well loved by citizens, and students, and the Police Commissioner did exonerate him in those hearings stating that due process was not allowed. Officer Defina is right to state his opinion. There has been no disciplinary action based on the departments' behavior by the department. If something happens to Mr. Sorel or anyone else, Officer Defina would be at his house defending his rights and protecting him.

D. Pearl, 79 Main Street: I would like you to reconsider your recommendation to abolish the Police Commission. If you still feel that way, I think next year would be better. The Police Commission asked for an audit last night. It would be counterproductive to stop mid-stream this year. I don't know if the Councilors will have the time to put into the Police Department. They were trying to rectify the statement regarding the West Side Car and it took over 20 minutes to get an answer. The Chief would not give a direct answer. I think in our current situation, the Commission should be allowed to complete the work they have started.

T. Lizotte, 21 Post Road: I was at the Police commission meeting as well. What I got out of that meeting was hyper sensitivity when a posted note on a door warranted 3 days suspension. You can't take a government organization and apply principals from general industry. In business, you can treat employees as you wish and they can leave. In government, it is different. My feeling is when you look at Mr. Defina's assertions; they are a status of Whistle Blower and are based on factual evidence contrary to those made against him which had a false premise.

The recent review of the Charter, of which I read the report provided, there were some interesting things but it does ignore evidence that the economic down term has effective why people don't run for positions. I think people are not aware of the opportunities. There is a lack of mentoring. There should be some mentoring and we need to ask people to participate. People think they need to have a degree in accounting to be on the Budget Committee. We lack media outlets. The Union Leader is focused on Manchester and the Banner is limited. I think it is beneficial to have two separate elections and this allows time to get all the information out to the public.

OLD BUSINESS

<u>Budget</u>

B. Gahara proposed funding a .05% wage pool of \$15,915 for town employees which would be funded by reducing tipping fees by \$14,000 and the library budget \$1808. When we started the budget we looked at trying to get money for a wage pool. As we tracked, we had a CIP. The plan proposes a CIP warrant of a straight line reduction in the CIP Warrants for the first year and keeping mandatory request. This results in a 25 cent increase in the tax rate.

H. Shumway stated that the Library is not prepared to make any reductions in the budget.

D. Boutin stated that he supports placing the merit wage pool in the operating budget and proposed funding by reducing the part time police budget line which has been consistently under spent.

N. VanScoy motioned to not require reconsiderations on any motions previously made on the budget. Seconded by V. Lembo. <u>Vote unanimously in favor.</u>

D. Boutin motion to reduce the Part time line 113 on the Police Commission budget by \$40,000. Seconded by N. VanScoy.

J. McHugh, Police Commissioner stated that the reason that line was under expended was one part time employee was out of work due to surgery and has since returned and the other is for part time investigation.

D. Boutin stated that the Chief's testimony regarding these positions was they are not regular part time positions. They are basically on call. It hasn't previously been expended at that level and this is a reasonable reduction that will not interfere with the operation of the department.

C. Soucie stated that according to the back-up provided by the Police Commission, the part time clerk is \$34,000 and the part time investigator is \$39,000.

N. VanScoy asked if D. Boyce could address the proposed reduction in the tipping fees.

D. Boyce: I'm worried about a reduction of \$14,000 and I budgeted based on historical data. In 2009, we generated more than this year. I can't predict what the economy will do. On the disposal fees, everything is spelled out and there is not too much fluctuation.

B. Gahara: I do not support this budget. We had a plan and 28 cents is too much for me to vote for. I am more inclined to support a 23 cent increase. That is a significant number. We should have stayed with the plan. This action of putting the backhoe in defeats that purpose. I will vote no.

The percentage below last year's budget is .051%

B. Gahara: When we took the \$120,000 and added it to the budget for backhoe and will remove \$37,500 from the CIP, we are still at 28 cents. The tax implication on just the budget is a reduction of .07 cents.

Note: 1)Agent can approve spending from this fund for only ambulance service expenditures. Voters, through a warrant article, could restrict expenditures from the fund by limiting types of items or services that may be

purchased. Also no money may be spent from the revolving fund for any item or service for which an appropriation has been specifically rejected by the voters during the same year.

2) After the first year of this fund passing Ambulance expenses should be removed from Fire-Rescues operating budget.

N. VanScoy motioned to move as read and written. Seconded by J. Levesque. Vote unanimously in favor

Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 31:95-c to restrict 100% of revenues from Hooksett School District for snow plowing & grass mowing to expenditures for the purpose of Public Works provided maintenance and equipment for the school's parking lots and grounds, including plowing, sweeping, mowing, painting of fields etc.? Such revenues and expenditures shall be accounted for in a special revenue fund known as the Parking Lots and Grounds Maintenance fund, separate from the general fund. Any surplus in said fund shall not be deemed part of the general fund accumulated surplus and shall be expended only after a vote by the legislative body to appropriate a specific amount from said fund for a specific purpose related to the purpose of the fund or source of the revenue. Majority vote required."

Note: Voters need to approve spending from this fund via warrant article. Requires public hearing per RSA between March 11th and April 26th
