7:30pm Chair Connor called the meeting to order

Mr. Ray presented the project to include the construction of a handicap accessible walkway. The walkway will be elevated on concrete sonotubes then exit onto a new concrete platform. The area below the walkway will be covered with gravel. Areas where existing pavers are removed will be seeded.

Mr. Rosen began the hearing with his interpretation of the existing conditions of the site. He stated that around the opening of the culvert where there is tidal flow, there is a salt marsh community. There is *Spartina patens*, and there is peat formation, which he believes is key to the function of a salt marsh. Mr. Rosen stated that the salt marsh, as delineated by the applicant, is overwhelmingly the *spartina patens*, but the area to the north of it, is all *Distichlis*. It is his opinion that since there is no peat, and *spartina patens* are not dominant in the area north of their delineation, the Applicant's recent delineation of the salt marsh is correct. Mr. Rosen's delineation is at the boundary of *Spartina patens* and *Distichlis*. There was no new plan submitted.

Mr. Manganello reiterated his previously stated findings and his interpretation of the definition of a salt marsh from the Wetlands Protection Act. It is his opinion that the definition does not limit the boundary to areas dominated by *spartina patens* and *alternifloras*. Mr. Manganello also highlighted the portion of the definition referring to the salt marsh extending to the highest spring tide. He also stated that the definition does not refer to the absence of peat as being used in determining the boundary. Mr. Manganello commented that the regulations pertaining to dominant plants is not meant to define the limits of a salt marsh. Mr. Manganello stated that *Spartina patens* do exist up to the high tide line on this site.

Mr. Nylen gave his interpretation of the definition of a salt marsh and that it is his opinion that the *Spartina* patens must be the dominant plants for determining a salt marsh. Mr. Nylen stated that the site does not have a gravity fed high tide and therefore the site cannot be found to have a salt marsh.

Commission members discussed their observations of the site being 3/4 inundated with water at high tide on several occasions.

Mr. Reilly questioned whether the salt marsh is significant.

Upon a motion by J. Meschino and 2nd by P. Epstein and a vote of 2/4/1 (S. Bannen abstained) It was voted:

The **motion** to accept the wetland delineation of the Applicant was denied.
