HULL CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT BOARD MEETING

February 27, 2007 9:00 a.m. (Selectmen's Meeting Room)

The regular meeting of the Hull Contributory Retirement Board, duly posted to be held in the Selectmen's Meeting Room, Town Hall, Hull, MA on the above date was called to order at 9:00 a.m. Present were Marcia Bohinc, Chairperson, Members Leonard Colten, Maurice Murphy, Gerald Ball, Rocky Tenaglia, and Retirement Administrator, Jennifer Miller.

To Be Voted:

Read and attest to the minutes from the January 23, 2007 regular Board Meeting. Motion made by Leonard Colten seconded by Rocky Tenaglia to accept the minutes of the meeting held on January 23, 2007 with corrections.

Unanimously voted:

9:00 a.m. – Paula Delaney, Superintendent – Maria Hortaridis, Business Manager – Discussion on FY 06 and FY 07 Federal Grants. Marcia Bohinc informed the Board that she had met with Dr. Delaney on Monday, February 26, 2007 and that they had discussed the matter of the reimbursement of the Federal Grant for fiscal year 2006. Although Dr. Delaney was sympathetic to the Board's desire to recover the loss of payment, she reiterated what Maria Hortaridis had stated at the January 23, 2007 meeting, regarding the financial condition of the school and the tough current fiscal year. She agreed to follow the school finances for this fiscal year and to report back to the Board in May or June as to where they stand with their finances. Should their finances look good and they have extra money, they would pay some money towards the 2006 grants. Dr. Delaney was not very optimistic.

Marcia explained how the appropriation works, and that she felt the Board should accept that it would be receiving the FY07 reimbursement, and all future grant reimbursements, and move on.

Ms. Bohinc explained that the reimbursement payment was not the same as the Housing Authority's appropriation. The only source of the Housing Authority money was the Housing Authority. If the Housing Authority did not pay the appropriation money, then the retirement system was out the money. The grant money is another source of money received by the Town from the Federal Government. The Retirement System is not out \$12,000.00 because these grant people were in fact included in the Town's appropriation. We did receive the money from the Town. If we did not get the money from the Town, we would then have to get it from the school. If the school gives us the money and then is in the negative, then the Town has to give the school more money; it is all the same pot of money.

Ms. Bohinc further assured the Board that when you review the school grants, on the line to request monies to be paid for retirement benefits, there was no request made. Although the school may have overlooked this, they did not make a request for retirement benefits and keep it for themselves. There was no money requested for this benefit.

Mr. Colten felt that the school should provide copies of their financial statements to the Board for the Board's review. Ms. Bohinc informed him that this is what Ms. Delaney had offered to do in May or early June.

Leonard Colten felt that the school has the money and that they will spend it prior to the end of the fiscal year to avoid having to reduce their budget.

Marcia assured Mr. Colten that as the Town Accountant she knows that there is no hidden monies, that all of the town and school's monies are accurately accounted for.

Mr. Ball was happy with Dr. Delaney's guarantee that we will be receiving the FY07 and all future grant payments. Based on the fact that the retirement system was not actually out the money, Mr. Ball felt that the Board should accept the response and wait and see what happens in May or June.

In final, the Board decided that it would follow up on this matter with Dr. Delaney in May.

Jennifer Miller confirmed with John MacLeod, Hull Light Plant's Acting General Manager, that Mr. Reed retired from the 1st Class Lineman position, which is equivalent to the Journeyman Line of Local 104 and not the Head Lineman as calculated by Mr. Hynes.

After a review of the discrepancy in the number of weeks at each rate of pay, a complete review of week ending dates and check issue dates were completed. It was determined that the amount of earnings which would have been reported on Mr. Reed's W2 for calendar 2005 would have been \$69,474.00 and not \$69,248.40, therefore reducing the refund due to the retirement board to \$6,253.36 a reduction of \$225.60. See attached calculation.

The Board stands firm on its decision and will begin making payroll deductions in March. It will discuss whether it will obtain counsel at a later date.

Review

Jennifer Miller – 12 month merit review effective September 6, 2005. Salary request \$30.00 hourly or \$46,800.00 annually based on 30 hours per week. Current salary \$28.85 hourly. The Board reviewed Jennifer Miller's self-evaluation, as well as Marcia Bohinc's evaluation and written opinion. All of the members were given a blank evaluation for their review and return with comments to Marcia Bohinc for future evaluations. The Board has been happy with Ms. Miller's performance and agreed that there is always room for improvements. The Board reviewed salary comparison from the PERAC Website. The Board also reviewed their original job posting and what their salary expectation was for the position. The recommendation for salary was discussed and determined that the position will become a salary position, based on 25 hours per week, at a rate of \$43,000.00 per year.

Motion made be Gerald Ball seconded by Rocky Tenaglia to increase the salary of the Retirement Administrator to \$43,000.00 annually based on a 25-hour workweek effective March 1, 2007.
