7.0 Business Items – Superintendent

7.1 Scholarship Fund

James Gillis, President of the Hull School Scholarship Fund said he is very proud of being part of the Scholarship Fund for the past fifteen years. He noted because of the support of the Hull residents students have received about \$160,000 to further education. At this time he is turning over the presidency to James O'Brien to continue the growth of the scholarship fund. He thanked School Committee, the Scholarship Committee, Hull High School students and Hull residents for their support over the years.

Kevin Richardson on behalf of the School Committee thanked Mr. Gillis for all he had done over the years for the students of Hull.

7.3 System-wide MCAS Presentation

Mildred O'Callaghan, Assistant Superintendent presented an overview of the district-wide MCAS long-range plan. The following are some of the areas Ms. O'Callaghan discussed:

- o Analysis of data for each school
 - Look at the general trends
 - Look at student specific needs
 - Provide individual student improvement plans
- o General Trends
 - Multiple choice questions
 - Open response questions
 - High School graduation goal 220 or better
- o ELA
 - Trends
 - Move students out of needs improvement
- Mathematics
 - Trends
 - Move students out of needs improvement
- o Scores
 - Scores show even levels or small amounts of growth at some grade levels
 - Students need to be exposed to higher level mathematics instruction earlier
- Moving Target
 - The state just set 240, proficient, as the goal for future graduation requirements
- o Individual student improvement plans
 - Provide means for remediation i.e. during school, after school, summer
 - Emphasize home/school partnership
- o District Level
 - Review curriculum maps at each level
 - Align curriculum to provide students with timely instruction related to MCAS needs
 - Provide professional development as determined to provide teachers with instruction tools
 - Provide frequent assessments across grade levels to monitor student progress
- Resources needed
 - Continued funding for professional development
 - Funding to purchase assessment tools
 - Funding for remediation programs that occur outside of the school day
 - Support for re-structuring recommendations
