# 7.0 Business Items – Superintendent

7.1 Scholarship Committee – Mr. James O'Brien

James O'Brien, Hull Scholarship Committee President, introduced Committee Members Terry Richardson, Janice Marcella, Kristen Woodley, and Geri Calos. He also noted that School Committee Chair Kevin Richardson was a member of the Committee.

Mr. O'Brien gave the following information regarding the Scholarship Committee:

- Began about twenty years ago to provide funds to students going on to college
- Has approximately one-half million dollars in secure CD's
- Objective going forward will be to continue to raise money
- Receive donations throughout the year
- An organized event will take place in February 2008 to raise money
- Working with Hull Alumni.com to have an annual appeal to Hull graduates as a fundraiser

He thanked past Scholarship Committee members, School Committee, administrators and teachers for their support over the years.

# 7.2 School Committee Goals

Chairman Kevin Richardson read the Hull School Department Mission Statement and discussed the following five School Committee goals:

- Curriculum
  - To implement a high standards curriculum, linked to the Massachusetts Frameworks, vertically and horizontally aligned across all grades and content areas, and supported by investments in professional development that ensure effective instructional programs.
  - o Continue to capitalize on our small district and class sizes to provide effective instruction.
  - o Implement quarterly presentations at our meetings on curriculum assessments and administration for implementation.

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# • Fiscal Transparency

- o School Committee members will participate in town-wide governmental groups including Advisory Committee and other ad hoc committees.
- Work with the school administration to develop financial status reports to be distributed to all committee members.
- o Increase communication and utilization of website regarding budget process.
- o Develop more comprehensive budget presentation for public consumption.
- o Establish regular budget workshops to educate the community on our budgetary process.

### • Communication

- o School Committee will work to encourage more parents to attend School Committee meetings, parental conferences and other school events.
- o School Committee will continue to hold monthly Community Outreach Forums on topics that are requested from the public.
- o School Committee members will attend school council meetings, PTO meetings and other events, seeking to maintain open lines of communication with parents in the community. School Committee will use such forums to help inform parents and community members of the district's budget and annual goals.

### • Labor Relations

 Negotiate financial settlements with units of our represented employees that assure fair and appropriate compensation packages, are in the best interest of students and within the financial means of the Town.

#### Evaluation Process

o Implement an effective evaluation tool and process for the Superintendent.
