7.2 Hull High School Mission Statement, Expectations and Core Values Michael Devine, Hull High School Principal, said that New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) provides accreditation to more than 2000 public and private schools in the New England area pre-kindergarten through university level. To maintain accreditation the school must do a self-study every ten years. Mark Galligan and Edwin Menon, Hull High School teachers are the Co-chairs of the Hull High School NEASC self study. In November 2011 a NEASC team will be visiting the high school for three and one-half days interviewing many various people. In the Spring of 2012 Hull High School will receive the final report from NEASC that will decide on the accreditation status of the high school. Mark Galligan and Edwin Menon, Hull High School teachers, presented the following information about the Hull High School NEASC self-study:

Lynda Feeney, Memorial Middle School Principal, presented and discussed the following objectives:

 - o Increase teacher articulation of content and skills goals to students
- Curriculum and Instruction

 - To ensure Memorial Middle School maintains adequate yearly progress in both Mathematics and ELA MCAS
 - To consistently use the Memorial Middle School Writing/Grading Rubric across curriculums
 - To continue to refine curriculum maps within the middle school to ensure maximum time

 - Distribute student success plans with specific information about students progress and options for support
 - o Develop specific MCAS preparation classes
- Human Resources and Professional Development
 - Change focus of faculty meetings and professional development days to focus on effective teaching strategies (reading and writing strategies) and assesses current scope and sequences for content areas
- Assessment and Evaluation
 - o Link rubric assessment throughout all curriculum areas
 - Analyze student scores on MCAS and Terra Nova

Donna Tobin, L.M. Jacobs School Principal, presented and discussed the following objectives:

- Communication
 - To improve communication to school parents and community members by varying the communication vehicles and through consistent scheduling of communications
 - To assist teachers in coordination of special events, gathering of resources, or projects to coordinate grade level needs
- Curriculum and Instruction
 - To map science curriculum across grade level and develop grade level focus areas aligned with frameworks
 - Develop consistent expectations for students and teachers for developing a learning community with effective classroom environments and a positive behavior intervention program
- Student Academic Support
 - To identify and develop plans for students not on IEPs who perform poorly on assessments or struggle with meeting the demands of the classroom curriculum and provide in school and after school interventions to allow for effective progress
 - To identify and develop plans for students who perform above grade level on classroom assignments and formal and informal assessments in order to provide a challenging learning environment and increase student engagement
- Human Resources and Professional Development
 - Offer a variety of professional development opportunities for all staff members
- Assessment and Evaluation
 - Develop five (5) common assessments at each grade level with common scoring guides to ensure consistency in expectations and student outcomes across grade levels
- Financial and Asset Management
 - To develop procedures and best practices for ordering, receiving and tracking supplies and materials at the teacher level.
