7.6 Free and Reduced Lunch Program

Superintendent discussed the following free and reduced lunch data:

- Students on free and reduced lunch are at or below the poverty level.
- In FY07 22% of Hull Public Schools students were on free or reduced lunch.
- 37% of students are on free or reduced lunch in FY11.
- We have more needs and less services.
- 40% of Memorial Middle School students are at or below the poverty level.
- The number of students on free or reduced lunch also affects the number of athletic waivers that are given out to students.

School Committee requested the free and reduced lunch data be posted to the school website.

7.7 College Board Second Annual AP District Honor Roll

Dr. Tyrell announced that the Hull Public School is one of 367 School districts in the United States and Canada being honored by the College Board with a place on the Second Annual Advanced Placement Honor Roll for simultaneously increasing access to Advanced Placement coursework while maintaining or increasing the percentage of students earning scores on three (3) or higher on AP exams.
