## 6.0 Business Items – Superintendent

6.1 M.A.S.S. Academic Excellence Award

Each year the Massachusetts Association of School Superintendents provides an award to a senior from every school district in the Commonwealth. The criteria for the selection of this award include cumulative average, class rank, and leadership. This year Dr. Tyrell presented the award to Kathryn Nicole Chaney. Dr. Tyrell read a long list of Ms. Chaney's accomplishments during her high school years.

Ms. Chaney is a credit to Hull High School and the Hull Community. School Committee and Superintendent congratulated Ms. Chaney.

## 6.2 John and Abigail Adams Scholarship

Dr. Tyrell announced that twenty Hull High School seniors have received the John and Abigail Adams Scholarship. This scholarship is awarded based on individual performance on grade ten MCAS English Language Arts and Mathematics tests. Students' receiving this scholarship makes them eligible for free tuition at the University of Massachusetts (any campus) or any of the Massachusetts state colleges, community colleges, or universities. #### 6.3 Pirate Pride Grant

Hull High School teacher, Ms. Sheila Blair, introduced the three student advisors, Stella Willis, Kate Pearson and Samantha Brown, who updated the Committee on The Real Friends Project: Real Pirate Pride, which included the following:

- The Philosophy
  - Students with and without disabilities have much to offer in friendships and each student should be recognized for the traits that make them enjoyable individuals to be around.
- The Mission
  - To facilitate and enhance authentic friendships between students with and without disabilities.
  - Expand these friendships to out of school activities such as going to the movies or to watch a sports event.
- Their first event Ice Cream Breaker
  - o 32 students
  - Food and drink
  - o Introduction Activity name and hobby
  - o Successes laughing, conversation and involvement
  - o Misses separation and unfamiliar territory
  - o Fixes training
- Future Ideas
  - Onsite Activities volleyball, football, board games, crafts, other social events.
  - Offsite Activities walk/hike, movies, sporting events, independent interaction.

The students thanked Ms. Harte for helping to get the grant and Ms. Blair for guiding them.

## 6.4 Emergency Operations Center

Dr. Tyrell introduced Deputy Fire Chief, Christopher Russo, who informed the Committee that there is now a room at the Memorial Middle School that is dedicated to the Emergency Operations Center. He said he would come back to a future School Committee meeting with pictures of the set up. He stated that there is new technology in the room and thanked Judi Saide and Dr. Tyrell for the successful collaboration.

#### 6.5 MCAS Presentation

Dr. Tyrell congratulated the Jacobs School for being a Level 1 school, which is the highest distinction. She said she was very pleased to report the growth in the MCAS scores at the Jacobs School. Dr. Tyrell presented the following MCAS information:
