6.0 Business Items – Superintendent

6.1 Green Team and Composting – Hull High School

The Green Team at Hull High School along with Ms. Sheila Blair, science teacher, reviewed the composting program at Hull High School. The Green Team members were Mark Abatuno, Lexi Angus, Quinn Whelan, and Thomas Nutsongtat. The students reviewed the three intiatives for the program. The first initiative is composting; the second initiative is to build gardens in the courtyard with the help of South Shore Collaborative; and the third initiative is to get rid of the water bottles at Hull High School. The program has been very successful with a noticeable reduction of trash at the school. The students also provided information on the composting internship at the school which is held during G period.

6.2 Empty Bowls Fundraiser

Head of the Hull High School Art Club, Kennedy Bain and Art Club member, Brittany Bain along with Amanda Held, art teacher, presented information on the Empty Bowls Fundraiser which is scheduled to be held on Thursday, April 16, 2015 from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. at the South Shore Art Center in Cohasset. The fundraiser is being held by Hull, Hingham, Braintree and Cohasset Ceramics and 3D art class students as well as the South Shore Art Center. The students are making the bowls for this event. All donations will go to Project Bread and Outreach, Inc.

6.3 Instructional & Literacy Coaches

Dr. Mary Merrigan, Instructional Coach, provided information on the K-8 coach model that the Hull Public Schools use. There are two coaches in the district, Dr. Merrigan, instructional coach (.6 FTE) and Dr. Joy Turpie, literacy coach (.4 FTE). They are embedded in the school day and work with the teachers. They collect data from Title I, PARCC, MCAS and meet with the teachers at Jacobs Elementary and Memorial Middle School regularly to discuss the data, the implications, and instructional shifts that may be necessary. The Jacobs School teachers meet every 3 weeks and the Memorial School teachers meet every 3rd week in each content area. Mary said this is a very progressive, forward thinking system that should prove successful.

6.4 FY16 Budget

Ms. Peters said that the School Committee met with the Advisory Board on Monday, March 16, 2015 to discuss the schools' FY16 budget and will meet again with them on Monday, March 30, 2015. The School Committee, Mr. Matthew Gillis and Ms. Judy Kuehn answered questions from Dennis Zaia and other audience members. Members of the School Committee informed the audience that information on the budget as well as a budget question and answer document can all be found on the Hull Public Schools website. The schools provide information to the community via the website, Facebook, Twitter, blogs, email blasts, and the Hull Times.
