Mr. Devine responded to School Committee questions and concerns. He told the Committee that the numbers have gone down a bit because there are fewer students so the numbers are still in a proper ratio. The Committee thanked Mr. Devine and the staff.

6.6 Special Town Meeting Article 6 Discussion, Hull Community Walking Track and Turf Field

Dr. Tyrell informed the Committee that she will be meeting with staff members and ask Mr. Matthew Gillis, School Business Administrator, to put together an RFP for the Hull Community Walking Track and Turf Field project. Committee members voiced their opinions about the way town meeting was handled but realize a vote was taken and they need to move forward on the track and field RFP to see what options are out there, because the Board of Selectmen, Advisory Board and the School Committee voted in support of the article. Committee members discussed the issue of the community being split over this but hope everyone can come back together to make the right decisions for the whole town. Safety and health concerns were raised and Mr. Gillis stated that the RFP's will address those issues along with all other issues relating to the project. Mr. Hipp added that one of the benefits of having it passed now is that we have significant time to get all information together before the debt exclusion.
