May 12, 2009

The meeting of the Hull Board of Selectmen was called to order at 7:32pm on Tuesday evening, May 12. 2009 at the Hull Municipal Building, 253 Atlantic Avenue, Hull, Massachusetts

Present: Joan Meschino, Chairman; Christopher Olivieri, Vice Chairman; Domenico Sestito, Clerk. John Reilly, and Dennis Blackall, Members. Also present were: Philip Lemnios, Town Manager, and James Lampke, Town Counsel.

In Memoriam

The Board observed a moment of silence on the passing of Charles E. Feist, 67, a lifelong resident if Hull and for more than 42 years, and considered a dedicated senior custodian at the Hull High School..

7:30 pm – Public Hearing – Sweety Market Corporation dba Kenberma Food Mart, 437 Nantasket Avenue Mahendra Partel , Manager –Wines and Malts as a Package Goods Store

The Chairman opened the Public Hearing, explained the process, and had those wishing to speak sworn in.

Paul Healey, Attorney for Mahendra Partel, who is seeking a Beer and Wine License for the Kenberma Food Mart & gas station, presented Patel's internal policy document, and a diagram showing 10 coolers in the back to hold the product and secured with a locking device He added that there is only one entrance and that the emergency door is alarmed.. . He listed the hours as from 5:30am - 10:00 pm Healey said Patel had owned a Mobil station with a convenience store operating with a beer & wine license..

Healey referred to Patel as someone with experience, who is running a family business and has adopted a policy, has had no police problems, and will card every customer under 40 for the alcohol and for cigarettes.

Bob Healey of 442 Nantasket Avenue and Par Finn of 8 Telegraph Avenue were both in opposition stating the closeness of the business to the playground.

Reilly described the presentation as great but questioned whether or not there is a need. Olivieri requested that a background check and police report be provided.

OLD BUSINESS

1. Revitalization of Nantasket Beach Business District

Olivieri spoke about the prospects of contracting with the DCR and on a proposed plan to revitalize the business district at Surfside, and the possibility of returning Nantasket Avenue back to a 2-way street. He said there is a need to develop zoning. and suggested referring it to the Zoning Bylaw Committee

Reilly suggested inviting the planning board and **HRA** to a meeting and mentioned a story in Saturday's Ledger as parking is not the real story which is that Hull has had a 100-yr relationship with the state in that area and it is no longer funding activities that is its obligation, especially police, and fire.

Blackall suggested studying the Master Plan comparing it to the DCR's drawings.

Also discussed was the support of Representative Bradley; the two bills pending to raise parking fees to \$7.00 to be placed in a Reservation Trust for maintenance and preservation; attempting to gain control by the Town, in some manner, of the unused buildings,, and a caution by Reilly not to lose sight of the purpose - which is the state must fund its Reservation.

OLD BUSINESS

Discussed under old business was the Marsden Inn, that had been denied a Lodging House License, and the Board was informed by David Kellem, Esq. that an appeal has been filed; that the high bidder on the town-owned property at 301 Nantasket Avenue has changed his mind and does not intend to go through with the purchase, which would be a breach of contract, but there is a possibility some deal may be forthcoming; Lemnios updated the negotiations with Verizon for a cable service and negotiations are moving along; and he explained a debt exclusion outside of Proposition 2 ½ that is \$1,642,000.

Meschino reminded everyone that this is the last meeting before the annual election to be held on May 18, 2009; and reminded everyone not to forget to vote each day for the carousel grant.
