Recreation Director – As of Wednesday AM, 4/8/15 the Town has received 21 resumes for the position. I am planning to convene an interview panel and would like a Select Board member to participate. I anticipate interviews will occur during the week of April 27.

Town Office Project – Father Bill gave a tour of the St. Partick's School property on 4/7/15. All participants were requested to submit comments by 4/13; Chip will be developing thoughts, ideas, options and recommendations within the next two weeks, after which the group should reconvene to first determine whether the property should be considered further, after which we can plan the next steps for this project.

State Legislation – We are tracking the following:

- a) Renewable Energy Fund The House has proposed sweeping this dedicated revenue into the General Fund to help balance the upcoming budget; this action would in all probability impact the Town's application before the PUC for the landfill solar array.
- b) Pole Tax Fairpoint is attempting to dictate the method by which communities may assess poles within their jurisdiction, which may result in tax burden shift to other property taxpayers.

G. Other Business

1) 2015 Goals and Objectives

Caron reviewed Goals and Objectives for 2014 and 2015 with the Select Board.

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2) Resolution 2015-04 - Relative to a Lease-Purchase Agreement for a CAT Road Grader

Motion by Rothermel, seconded by Moore to approve Resolution 2015-04 – Relative to a Lease-Purchase Agreement for a CAT Road Grader was approved (3-0).

3) Resolution 2015-05 – Employee Performance Review Policy

Motion by Moore, seconded by Rothermel to table until April 27th BOS Meeting, approved (3-0).

4) Dogs on the Common

The Town has experienced a significant issue over this past winter with animal owners neglecting to clean up after their pets on town property, particularly at the Town Common. Thanks to volunteers from Team Jaffrey, the Common was cleaned last Friday.

The Town has two options to rectify this health hazard. First, the Town has the option to prohibit dogs from town property, similar to the regulations in effect at the ballfield. I suspect this option may produce objections from the community, as many responsible dog owners enjoy visiting the Town Common or walking the trail with their dogs. To accomplish this, the Select Board would need to amend the exisiting town ordinance.

Another option available to the Town is to aggressively enforce the current town ordinance which considers a dog to be a nuisance "if it digs, scratches or excretes....on property other than its owners;" The Town can produce signage which alerts dog owners to this violation, along with a copy of the fine schedule (\$25.00 first offense; \$100.00 each subsequent offense). Accompanying this option is a recommendation to slightly alter an existing town ordinance to mirror the state's definition of when a dog is adjudged to be a nuisance.

The Select Board directed Caron reinforce the ordinance and to come up with a plan to clean up the Common.
