




Do you own an old barn or love an old barn? Recognizing a growing rate of barn demolition and collapse, the N.H. Preservation Alliance is pleased to share details of a 2017 campaign to help preserve at least 52 barns across the state with planning grants, education and promotion of a local tax relief program for barns.



"We're losing almost a barn a day," said program director Beverly Thomas. "With the crisis in the dairy industry and the experts citing a pending bubble of need due to deferred maintenance of 19th century barns, the Alliance geared up to do more," she added.

"Every community in the state can benefit from this opportunity to help owners and supporters of historic barns to strengthen, and perhaps find new or renewed purposes for these iconic buildings," said Lorraine Merrill, Commissioner of N.H. 
