### BITS of HISTORY from The NEWMARKET ADVERTISER

January 27, 1894 (continued from last week's article)

The Hodgdon Bros of Epping cut a thousand cakes of ice for the Wadley's people in a few hours last week. It was done by ploughing, a neater and more rapid method than the old way of sawing. The ice is of very poor quality

The pupils of the So. Lee school will give their exhibition next Thursday evening, at the Union meeting house. All are welcome. Their teacher, Miss Demerritte, seems to be a painstaking preceptress, devoted to her pupils interest.

A large audience listened to the very interesting lecture on Alaska Tuesday evening One gentleman said he would give fifty cents, another was ready to part with a dollar, could they have the privilege of hearing a continuation of the same.
