The Conservation Commission wishes to express a sincere thank you to Dave and Sharon Meeker for placing a conservation easement on approximately 15 acres of their land along the Lamprey River just downstream of Wadleigh Falls. The easement will ensure in perpetuity that the land will not be developed and will be used by any future owners consistent with conservation practices. The Southeast Land Trust of NH (SELT) as owner of the easement will monitor the property yearly to ensure that it is being managed in accordance with the legal requirements of the easement.

It's time to think about going camping this summer!

Once again the Lee Conservation Commission will sponsor a campership, as we do most years, to Barry Conservation Camp, which is located in Berlin, NH at the Fish Hatchery. "Barry Conservation Camp emphasizes environmental awareness, responsible use of firearms, safe hunting practices, conservation principles and ethics." 


LEE HERITAGE COMMISSION



The Jeremiah Smith Grange is a former church building, built in 1841, which was converted to a grange hall in 1891 and still serves as a center for various community gatherings in Lee.

The Jeremiah Smith Grange is named for Jeremiah Smith (1759-1842). Born in Peterborough, NH, Smith attended Harvard College in 1777, which he left to serve under New Hampshire's General John Stark during the Revolutionary War. After his military service, Smith entered Queen's (now Rutgers) College, New Jersey, from which he graduated in 1780. Over the course of his career, Jeremiah Smith practiced law, then served as a New Hampshire representative to the U.S. Congress for several years, after which he returned to New Hampshire to serve as a judge. Smith later served as the chief justice of the Superior Court of Judicature of New Hampshire 1802-1809; governor of New Hampshire in 1809 and 1810; and Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court of New Hampshire 1813-1816. 


