A Bit Of History

July 10, 1869: The Recent Parricide in New Hampshire – Particulars of the Case

Mr. Crawford, of Lee, N.H., who was recently shot by his son, died yesterday. The particulars of the affair are as follows: On the day before the tragedy some boys had greatly irritated Mr. Crawford by firing guns in the vicinity of his house, so much so that he had fired at them to stop, and had wounded one in the leg. On Tuesday, the next day, a dispute arose between Crawford and his son in regard to the time the boys had been firing, when Crawford called his son a liar, and threatened to break a chair over his head; the boy daring him to do so, Crawford struck him with one. Then the boy went to his room and got his revolver, and Crawford got an ax and tried to knock his son down stairs, hitting him once near the shoulder and then in the bowels, and then the father was over powered by a neighbor. Crawford had ungovernable temper, and had several times threatened his son. The vouth had procured the revolver for defense of his life.
