### TOWN CENTER BUILDINGS PROJECT UPDATE

The Town Center Vision Committee made a presentation at the Deliberative Session on Saturday, February 3, 2018. CLICK HERE to see a copy of this presentation.

The Town Center Vision Committee was formed to inform Lee residents about the condition of the town center buildings and the proposed plan for facility renovation and modernization of the structures. The town center buildings consist of the Town Hall, Lee Library, Lee Historical Society Building (old South Lee freight depot building), the Town Annex, and the Tool Shed with Tramp Room, also known as the Hobo Shed.

In previous weeks E-Crier articles, we showed the conditions at the Town Hall, Lee Library, Tool Shed, Lee Historical Society Museum and the town Annex. This week we will be focusing on the proposed solution for these buildings as well as the proposal to purchase some property from the Lee Church Congregational next to the town center so there is additional space for growth.



## TWO HISTORIC LEE TOWN CENTER BUILDINGS HAVE RECENTLY BEEN APPROVED FOR THE NH STATE REGISTER OF HISTORIC PLACES!

The Lee Heritage Commission is delighted to share that it has received word this week that the Lee Town Hall and the Town Shed with Tramp Room are now listed on the NH State Register of Historic Places! The application regarding the Lee Historical Society Museum is still pending. It will be considered at an upcoming NHDR meeting. Stay tuned for an update on this.

We've just received word that the Lee Town Hall *and* the Tool Shed with Tramp Room have now received their Determination of Eligibility Letters from the first NHDHR committee! This means that they will be considered for the NH State Register of Historic Places at the January meeting of the State Historical Resources Council!


