There will be a Public Hearing to hear comment on the citizens' petition Warrant Article that proposes to rescind SB2. Before the Town adopted what is known as SB2 in 2011, the voters convened once a year at Town Meeting to discuss the budget and other warrant articles and to vote on them at that meeting. Since 2012, the Town holds a Deliberative Session once a year to discuss the budget and other warrant articles and to possibly amend them before they are all placed on the ballot for a vote at what is known as the Second Session or Ballot Session which is held a few weeks later in March.

MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATIONS WILL BE INTERRUPTED AT THE TOWN CLERK'S OFFICE FROM FEBRUARY 17TH – 22ND

The NH Department of Safety, Division of Motor Vehicles will be implementing a new computer system (VISION); therefore there will be an interruption of motor vehicle registration for both new and renewal processing statewide from 2/17 through 2/21, resuming transactions on 2/22. What does this mean for Lee residents?

Simply stated, although the Town Clerk-Tax Collector's Office will be open as usual, they <u>will not</u> be able to complete motor vehicle transactions <u>beginning Friday</u>, <u>February 17th thru Tuesday</u>, <u>February 21st</u>. If you need to renew your registration in February, you may renew online or by mail and the Town Clerk's Office will process it when they are back on-line or come into the Clerk's Office avoiding Friday – Tuesday, February 17th – 21st. <u>If you have a special circumstance</u>, please call the Town Clerk's Office (603-659-2964), as soon as possible, so that you can be advised on how to proceed.
