

**The answer to last week's trivia question:** Peter's Oven is a small cave that's located off of George Bennett Road in the Town of Lee. The book "Landmarks in Ancient Dover, New Hampshire" by Mary Pickering Thompson (1892) gives some fascinating details about this geographic feature of Lee. In Mary Thompson's words:

PETER'S OVEN. This name is given to a natural cave in the side of a steep ledge, a short distance above Lee Hill, on the right hand side of the road to Barrington. It is mentioned July 10, 1721, when 100 acres of land, originally granted to Wm. Williams, Sr., in 1662, and laid out to Wm. Roberts in 1663, on the west side of "Wheel Rights Pond" (sic), were laid out anew to Moses Davis and John Thompson, Jr., beginning at a pitch-pine tree on the west side of the cartway that leads to "Peter's Oven", so called (sic). And again May 29, 1752, when land on "the south side of the way leading from the place commonly called Peter's Oven to the head of the township", was conveyed by John Pitman to Jonathan Thompson, Jr. One tradition says the name was derived from an Indian named Peter, who, wounded at the battle of Wheelwright's Pond, succeeded in reaching this cave, into which he crawled and there died. According to another tradition, it was so called "from a negro (sic) named Peter, who once made it his haunt..."

The name of "oven" is often given to a cave in Ireland, from the Irish word *Uamhain*, pronounced *oovan*, hence the corruption "oven". *Uamhain* is evidently akin to the Gaelic word *Uaimh* used by Scott, who in "Waverly," gives the name of *Uaimh an Ri* or *Chieftain's Cave*, to the dwelling place of Donald Bean Lean. (Editor's note: This is referring to *Waverley*, a historical novel by Sir Walter Scott, 1771-1831.)

Peter's Oven is also part of the story line in "The Story of Peter Little Bear (A Lamprey River Adventure)" by David Allan (co-author Leslie Hamilton, illustrations by Amy Daskall), an historical novel for middle readers that uses real artifacts, events, and locations to tell a tale of friendship and adventure in seventeenth-century New Hampshire.




