<u>A Bit of History</u>

(Lee News) Newmarket Advertiser: April 21, 1894

SILVER WEDDING: The home of Mr. and Mrs. Erza Parsons at Packer's Falls was the scene of a most enjoyable gathering, on the evening of April 11th, the occasion being the twenty-fifth anniversary of their marriage. Although the wild and inclement weather doubtless prevented the attendance of many friends, yet more than thirty of their neighbors braved warring elements to manifest their esteem and respect for this worthy couple. Mr. and Mrs. Parsons are two of our most aged people in town, yet the courtesy and earnest anxiety for the welfare of their guests would compare most favorably with the etiquette of modern times. The exercises of the evening consisted of "The Silver Wedding Hymn" read by Miss Ruth Wiswall of this town. This famed selection has borne its part at two golden and two silver weddings at previous times and we trust to hear it repeated at some future occasion, as it is one of those rare compositions which repetition but increases its beauty; recitation by Miss Bunker, also several selections from Mrs. E. B. Griffiths. Then the people were escorted to the dining room, where the bride and groom were seated side by side, being supported by Deacon and Mrs. T.H. Wiswall, who most efficiently acted the parts of bridesmaid and best man. Submitted by Road Agent Randy Stevens, who has been researching Lee's history in his spare time. Thanks Randy!
