STEVENS FIELD (Next to the Public Safety Complex) CLOSED UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE

Stevens Field was constructed in 1997 and was intended to be a temporary field. It has been used extensively over the past sixteen years with very little maintenance besides mowing. Each year the grass looks a bit more stressed and more barren spots appear, especially where the foot traffic is the heaviest.

The Board of Selectmen, at its meeting on April 28th voted to close Stevens Field for the season to allow it time to rest and be rehabilitated. The plan is to reseed the barren sections and to fertilize and lime the entire field. Once established the new grass will be mowed high to provide for some shade and to allow the grass to thicken up.

Because of this <u>all sports and other activities will be banned</u> from taking place on the field until further notice. Residents will still be able to walk across the field to utilize the trails.

LEE POLICE ACCREDITATION UPDATE

The Lee Police Department is currently in a self-assessment period so that we may transition from Recognition to Advanced Accreditation. The Advanced Accreditation process will include an additional 300 standards. The Lee Police Department is expecting to attain Advanced Accreditation within the next year. The Lee Police Department is committed to preserving the peace, upholding the laws, and providing excellence in police service in partnership with the community.





LEE FIRE NEWS

Recently the Fire Department hired part-time Firefighter/Emergency Medical Technician Max Brown. Max comes to the Town of Lee with 5 years of experience on a local fire department and ambulance. The Town now has three Firefighter/Emergency Medical Technicians on staff Monday through Friday 6am to 6pm including the full-time Fire Chief and full-time Lieutenant Dan Brothwell. This allows us to better serve the Town during the day time hours when it is difficult for our on-call firefighters and emergency medical technicians to respond due to their other responsibilities. We have a roster of 23 dedicated on-call personnel that make up the department. IT'S THE LAW! FIRE PERMITS REQUIRED

EVERY person, firm or corporation who kindles or causes to be kindled any fire or burns or causes to be burned any material, except when the ground is covered with snow, SHALL obtain a written fire permit from the Forest Fire Warden in the town or city where the fire will be kindled.

"*Category I Fire*" means a small controlled fire, such as a camp or cooking fire, no greater than 2' in diameter contained within a ring of fire resistive material or in a portable fireplace. A category I fire, conditions permitting, may be kindled <u>with a permit</u> at any time of day whether raining or not.

"*Category II Fire*" means a controlled fire, such as a camp or cooking fire, no greater than 4' in diameter contained within a ring of fire resistive material or in a portable fireplace. A category II fire, conditions permitting, may only be kindled <u>with a permit</u> between the hours of 5:00 pm and 9:00 am unless it is actually raining.

"*Category III Fire*" means any other fire, not a category I or category II fire or a fire greater than 4' in diameter or a fire not contained within a ring of resistive material. A category III fire, conditions permitting, may only be kindled <u>with a permit</u> between the hours of 5:00 pm and 9:00 am unless it is actually raining.

A gas grill or charcoal fire in a container up and off the ground and kindled by the landowner or with the landowner's permission does not require a written fire permit.
