The Lamprey Rivers Advisory Committee is seeking creative, hard-working individuals or groups to apply for small grants that help to spread the word about the Lamprey River. The committee seeks projects whose goal is outreach that highlights protection of the river's outstanding wildlife & ecology, history, recreation, or other attributes.

Past projects: videos; town trail planning & mapping; land & soil conservation education; water conservation education and making rain barrels; mapping historic mill sites; on-site septic system reviews for landowners; Lamprey River Curriculum revision; creation of a lending library of tools to remove invasive plants.

Projects need to address an issue identified in the Lamprey River Management Plan. Visit lampreyriver.org/about-us-2007-mgmt-plan-revision. Grants up to \$5000 will be considered for the best proposals. Please note that not more than 10% of the grant budget can go toward overhead costs.

RAID ROCKINGHAM ROAD RIDE

The 2nd Annual Raid Rockingham will take place on **Sunday, June 9th**. This is a dirt road ride that will pass through Lee.

We expect about 200 riders this year. The ride originates in Newmarket. By the time they reach Lee, riders will be spread out thinly. The route will enter Lee on Route 152, from the West side of Route 125. Riders will cross Route 125 and enter Demeritt Ave, onto Cartland Road and Lee Hill Road. Riders will then pass through Lee on Route 155 and exit via Packers Falls.

All riders will be observing the rules of the road, with particular emphasis on the Route 125 signal. Please watch cyclists and warning signs as cyclists approach this intersection.

GRASS FIELD AT LITTLE RIVER PARK

The Board of Selectmen, Recreation Commission and ORYA Staff members met on Tuesday night at Little River Park to review the plans for construction of a Multi-Purpose Grass Field, which was approved by the voters in March.

The Highway Department has already begun to move material on site and will soon be trucking loam from Noble Farm to Little River Park. A Request for Proposals for an irrigation system has been issued and we anticipate that construction of the field will begin by July 1st.

FIREFIGHTERS and EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHS

Expand your horizons, your sense of community, and your job skills. Experience is not required; we will provide you with all necessary training. Responders need not be available during the day, and all training is scheduled to accommodate the working person's schedule. Respond to a variety of emergency calls. Receive full training and all equipment at the Department's expense. We need people who are willing to make a long-term commitment to the Department and the community, whose hearts beat a little faster at the sound of a siren, and who desire to do something a bit out of the ordinary with their lives.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Time commitment? As much time as you can afford. The Department meets 3 Thursdays each month for training and activities. Firefighters and EMTs respond to emergencies as they are able.

Age limit? An individual can become a firefighter or EMT at the age of 18 and continue on as long as they wish to be an active member. Our longest standing active member joined the Lee Fire Department 30 years ago.

Training? Training is available for Firefighters and EMTs. Both classes are about 4 months long and based on adult continuing education principles. Training occurs after work (regular business hours) and weekends.

TOWN FOREST TRAILS

It has been noted that several trails in the Lee Town Forest have been altered or re-configured without approval from the Conservation Commission. Of particular concern are alterations made to the Yellow Trail. Because most of the Town Forest trail system is on land protected by conservation easement, disturbance of topography, wetlands, soils, or natural habitat is prohibited. Prior approval by the Lee Conservation Commission is required before any such change is undertaken.

Various groups have proposed projects to the Conservation Commission such as: clearing debris from established trails; rebuilding bridges; re-painting trail blazes; on occasion, re-routing a specific leg of a particular trail. In each instance the interested party has met with the Commission, walked the trail in question with members of the Commission, and carried out the project with members of the Commission present to provide oversight and assistance.

Anyone wishing to undertake such a project within the confines of the Town Forest or other lands under conservation easement is asked to first consult with, and receive approval from, the Conservation Commission.

May 28, 1898

*Eastern N.H. Pomona Grange meets with Jeremiah Smith Grange on Thursday next, June 2. A good programme for the afternoon is being arranged.

*There will be a strawberry festival in the C.E. vestry on Tuesday evening, May 31. The usual attractions will be presented, and it is hoped a good number will be present.

*The programme for Commencement exercises at the college in Durham, from June 5 to 8, has been received, and of the 18 names in the class roll three belong in Lee – Miss Helen Buzzell, Miss Bernice E. Caverno and Alfred Durgin.

*The socials which have been held monthly in the vestry have been well attended and pleasant times reported. At the last one, although the evening was stormy, about sixty were present. Cake and ice cream were served. Several kind friends from Durham assisted in the entertainment with readings and music.
