LEE VFW POST 10676 MEMORIAL DAY CELEBRATION



The Lee Memorial VFW Post 10676 is coordinating the **May 25th** Memorial Day parade which will step off at 1:00 pm from the Town Hall led by the Post 10676 color guard. They will be followed by other veterans marching and in automobiles. Other participants will include Cub Scouts, Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, Lee Church women's Guild, Colonial Militia, a Lee Rescue vehicle and Fire truck. Traffic control will be provided by the Lee Police. A ceremony will be held at the Town Park with patriotic musical selections from the Lee Church choir, readings by Post members and a speech given by Lt. Col. Bradley Nadig, Commander of the Army ROTC Detachment at UNH. A memorial wreath will be laid by post member Jud Porter. After a memorial prayer given by Reverend Michael Bradley of St. George's Episcopal Church Durham, a salute will then be fired by the Militia using musket and cannon. The ceremony will conclude with TAPS.

The Post is collecting names of veterans who have served or are serving in a military conflict while residing in the Town of Lee. These names will be added to the monument stone at the Town Park.

We are always looking for new members. Veterans with foreign service, bring your DD214 to any meeting at 7:30pm on the 1st Monday of each month at the Lee Safety Complex.

The Post is still collecting old, unserviceable flags to be disposed of. We will have a flag burning this fall to properly retire them. They may be dropped off at the recycle center during their business hours.

COME HELP PULL OUT THIS INVADER



This deceptively attractive flowering plant, Garlic Mustard, is a relatively recent invasive plant in NH. Once it gets established, it totally dominates the landscape by producing a massive seed bank and also releasing a chemical that inhibits the growth of other plants. It is of no value to wildlife and out-competes native plants that wildlife depends on. We have the opportunity to prevent this from happening. Join members of the Conservation Commission and other volunteers for an hour of pulling this invasive plant on **Wednesday, May 27TH**. We'll meet at the cemetery at the corner of Mast and Garrity Roads at noon. Much of our pulling will be on the sides of Rte. 155-A. Reflective safety vests will be provided. Bring gloves and take normal precautions for mosquitoes and ticks.

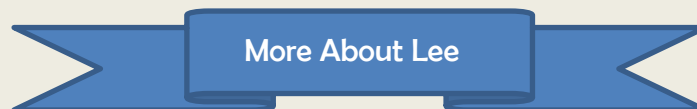
AWARD NOMINEE BOOKS

TROUBLESHOOTING EMAIL FILTERS

If your emails to receive the E-CRIER have repeatedly ended up in your spam folder then your internet provider may have stopped those emails from coming into your spam folder all together. You will need to sign up again and indicate that this is not spam.

If this is not the case, then your provider is blocking these emails and you will need to call them and ask for a 'whitelist'. This will essentially turn off their filter so you can receive these emails.
