NH DEPT OF REVENUE ADMINISTRATION -ANNUAL LOW & MODERATE INCOME HOMEOWNERS PROPERTY TAX RELIEF

New Hampshire residents who own a homestead subject to the State Education Property Tax, resided in the homestead as of April 1, 2013 and have a total household income of \$20,000 or less if a single person (or \$40,000 or less if married or head of household) may apply for property tax relief during the filing period after May 1, 2014, but no later than June 30, 2014. PLANNING BOARD UPDATE

The Town's Planning Board has been very busy this spring; possibly it's a sign of an economic burst? Although each and every application before the Board is equally as important and given the same careful review and consideration, I thought the following approved applications might be of interest to you.

On the residential side, the Board recently reviewed and approved a 13- lot cluster subdivision on Kelsey Rd. As part of this approval, 30+'acres will remain in open space for the public to enjoy.

In the commercial zone, the Board approved a 5-unit mini mall type of development on a lot between Lee Circle Grocery on Wheels and Wentworth Douglas Hospital. The only known tenants at this time are Subway and Aroma Joes. Construction is expected to start very soon.

On the lot located on the west side of Dunkin Donuts, the Board recently approved a Dollar General Retail store. It is my understanding that they are more of a mini grocery store than a dollar store similar to the one currently located at the circle. Construction is anticipated to start any day.

In the Light Commercial Zone, known as Noble Farm, the Board approved a 30,000 sq. ft. warehouse storage building. For those who don't know, the Town acquired this parcel by tax deed several years ago and sold it to Jim Daley last fall.






