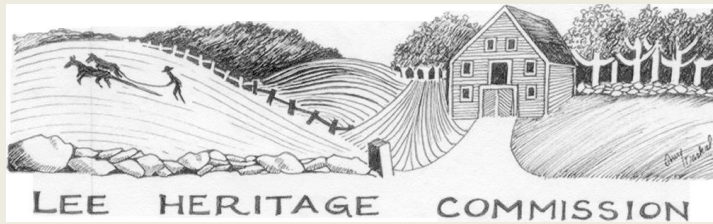

They serve Lee, Barrington, Durham, Madbury, Newmarket, Northwood, Nottingham and Strafford. Drivers receive 25 cents per mile and can pick what rides they want to do. Drivers must be at least 25 years old, have a valid driver's license and a favorable driving record with a legally registered, inspected and insured vehicle. You will need to complete a volunteer application that includes a motor vehicle and criminal background check. Head Start is a half-day national school readiness program for children ages 3-5 that provides comprehensive education, health, nutrition, and parent and community involvement services at our centers or in the home to children from eligible families in Strafford County. We offer an inclusive program with degreed teachers and individualized program. We have a school-year program and offer nutritious meals 5 days a week.

Early Head Start is a home-based program from families with children under the age of 3 and pregnant women that provides early, continuous, and comprehensive child development and family support services on a year-round basis to eligible families in Barrington, Dover, Farmington, Milton, Rochester and Somersworth. The program includes infant-toddler activities, comprehensive health care, nutrition, education, and social services for the children and their families.

DON'T BECOME A VICTIM!

The Lee Police Department would like to remind everyone about scams that are still being used. Some of these scammers have had success nationwide. Please do not become a victim.

- The caller advising that he is from Microsoft and wants to help you with a virus that is on your computer.
- The caller advising that he is from the IRS and you need to pay your back taxes.
- The caller advising that he is your grandchild and is in trouble in a different country and needs money wired to him.
- The caller, or a pop up message on your computer, advising that he is from the FBI and your computer contains child pornography, to unlock your computer you must pay a "fine".
- The caller advising that you missed a jury duty date and unless you pay a "fine" you will be arrested.
- The caller advising that you have won a lottery and you need to pay the taxes up front.

TROUBLESHOOTING EMAIL FILTERS

If your emails to receive the E-CRIER have repeatedly ended up in your spam folder then your internet provider may have stopped those emails from coming into your spam folder all together. You will need to sign up again and indicate that this is not spam. If this is not the case, then your provider is blocking these emails and you will need to call them and ask for a 'whitelist'. This will essentially turn off their filter so you can receive these emails.
