

NH DEPT OF REVENUE ADMINISTRATION -ANNUAL LOW & MODERATE INCOME HOMEOWNERS PROPERTY TAX RELIEF

New Hampshire residents who own a homestead subject to the State Education Property Tax, resided in the homestead as of April 1, 2013 and have a total household income of \$20,000 or less if a single person (or \$40,000 or less if married or head of household) may apply for property tax relief during the filing period after May 1, 2014, but no later than June 30, 2014. 

ORION TELESCOPE


