NH DRA'S ANNUAL LOW & MODERATE HOMEOWNERS PROPERTY TAX RELIEF PROGRAM

The Low and Moderate Income Homeowners Property Tax Relief provisions are designed to lessen the economic burden of the State Education Property Tax on certain taxpayers. NH residents who own a homestead subject to the State Education Property Tax, resided in the homestead as of April 1st of the year for which the claim for relief is being made, and have a total household income of \$20,000 or less if a single person (or \$40,000 or less if married or head of household) may apply for property tax relief during the filing period - after May 1, 2018, but no later than June 30, 2018. On May 21, 2018 the Lee Select Board authorized the formation of a Solid Waste Advisory Committee to consist of 5 Lee residents to work with Town staff and outside agencies to consider the following: review the actual volume and handling, transportation, and disposal costs associated with bulky items and make recommendations to the Select Board regarding an appropriate fee structure; research new waste disposal technologies, new or changed governmental regulations, changes in the local and worldwide demand for recycled materials and make recommendations for possible new approaches for disposal and recycling markets based on the findings; and develop a program to educate the public on solid waste disposal costs and recycling.

A Building Permit is required for all tents that are 400 square feet and over per the International Building Code adopted by NH and the Town of Lee. An Assembly Permit is required for all tents being occupied by more than 50 people per RSA 155:17-39. ATTENTION

Yard Sale season is upon us which brings up an issue of signs being posted improperly. Please remember that advertisements of any kind need to be posted on "free standing" posts not on telephone poles, street signs, markers, posts, etc. If you do put signs out for yards sales etc., please make sure that

they do not block the view of traffic, are not on town property, and, if on private property that you have the land owner's permission and that you remove them once the event is over. Signs that are left behind generally end up blowing away and become trash. Thank you!

CHAPTER 236

HIGHWAY REGULATION, PROTECTION AND CONTROL REGULATIONS Outdoor Advertising - Section 236:75

236:75 No Advertisements of Any Kind Upon Certain Objects. —Notwithstanding any provisions of the law to the contrary, it shall be unlawful to affix, attach or display any advertisement upon any object of nature, utility pole, telephone booth, or highway sign, directly in such a manner that the object of nature, utility pole, telephone booth, or highway sign, is utilized as an integral part of the sign's support as distinguished from being only incidentally a support to the sign, such as the earth or ground upon which a sign is affixed. This prohibition shall extend to all primary and secondary highways and roads of and within the state without exception for any type of advertising. The owner of an object upon which an advertisement is placed in violation of this section shall be entitled to remove and destroy the advertisement and the advertisement owner shall not be entitled to damages or compensation therefor. The object owner shall be entitled to collect the costs associated with the removal and destruction from the advertisement owner or the person who is responsible for placing the advertisement on the object in violation of this section.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT UPDATE

- **Phase 1 Paving** GMI paving has postponed paving Packers Falls and Garrity Roads until Tuesday and Wednesday of next week the 26th and 27th. Although there will be one lane open, travelers should expect delays and should find alternative routes if possible.
- **DOT Paving** The highway department has been notified that Pike Industries will be starting to get ready to pave Rt. 155 from Rt. 125 to 155A(5 corners) sometime around the 27th of this month.
- **Town Dock** As of this writing the crew is installing a sand texture final coat of paint on the topside of the dock, and sanding/priming/painting the dock support pipes. It is the crew's desire to install the dock back in the pond Monday the 25th (no promises though).
- Next week will most likely be consumed with Phase 1 paving, shoulder gravel on said roads, and fixing driveway entrances where necessary on said roads. Any spare time will be spent mowing cemeteries and/or starting roadside mowing.

POLICE DEPARTMENT UPDATE

- 1. No Permits shall be issued to any person, firm, partnership or corporation in the Town of Lee for the sale of fireworks.
- 2. Class "B" permits may be issued by the Fire Chief and Police Chief or their designee for the display of special fireworks.
- 2.1 Class "B" fireworks Display. The construction, handling, and use of fireworks intended solely for outdoor display as well as the general conduct and operation of display shall comply with the requirements of NFPA 1123, *Code for Fireworks Display*
- 2.2 Class "B" Saf-C 5003.01 Certificate Required
 No display of display fireworks shall be conducted unless at least one person with a
 current certificate of competency for the display of display fireworks is physically present at all times
 during the setting up, loading and firing of the display. The person with a current certificate of
 competency shall oversee and assure that the display is being conducted in a safe and secure manner.
 At the conclusion of the display, a safety sweep of the area will be conducted by the shooter to
 ensure no unexploded devices are left behind.
- 3. Class "C" Permissible fireworks as established for sale to the general public in the state of New Hampshire and authorized by the Commissioner of Safety may be displayed within the town in accordance with State of New Hampshire RSA 160-C. No special permit from the fire department is necessary. The display of permissible fireworks shall be performed in a manner that does not create an unsafe condition.



COME WALK WITH THE CONSERVATION COMMISSION TO SEE CONSERVED LANDS IN LEE! EVERY WEDNESDAY MORNING

Residents are invited to join members of the Conservation Commission any Wednesday morning while they conduct site walks on the Town's conserved properties. Some of these lands are owned by the Town, but most of them are privately owned and protected in perpetuity with a conservation easement. If you'd like to participate, call the Town Secretary, Denise Duval, at 659-5414. We meet in the Town Hall parking lot at 8:45 am, dressed for walking in the woods. Standard precautions for ticks & mosquitoes are advised. Walks take 1½-2 hrs.

Notes on Composting from the Gasowski Family by Paul Gasowski



Our household is participating in the Low Carbon Diet, a program



aimed at reducing our carbon footprint. The four-part workshop, which is being co-sponsored by Low Carbon Diet-Seacoast NH and the Lee Sustainability and Energy Committees, is being facilitated by Jen Messeder, a town resident. Among the many 'Lifestyle Practices' that one may adopt, reducing our household waste stream and the volume of waste that we take to our

transfer station is one of the featured actions. There are many ways to accomplish this, one of which is composting. I suspect that many people in Lee compost at home; it might be interesting to find out how many compost and to compare notes.



In the thirty-three years that our family has lived in Lee, we have always composted, refining our approaches and techniques over time. Our formal composting set-up at the Gasowski home utilizes a triple bin composter that is joined by an 'Earth Machine' and a 'custom-built' 55 gallon rotating drum. Yard waste, some leaves, rotted wood and some garden waste rotate through the three bays in the triple bin unit. We get a small amount of compost out of the second and third bins each year. On the food waste side, material is collected in two one-gallon totes and added to either the Earth Machine or the 55 gallon drum. We blend grass clippings and yard and garden waste to our suitable food waste in both units. While the Earth Machine was purchased at our recycling center a few years back, the 55 gallon drum was custom-built by Kent Kasper, a town resident; he built the unit from a design that he modified somewhat. In his system, the drum is mounted on a substantial wood frame and rotates a full 360 degrees; it is quite efficient.

In addition to this formal set-up, our leaves and branches are piled at various places on the woodlot to rot in place. In recent years, we have attempted to build some 'dens' for wildlife. Virtually all of this work is done by hand (pruning, raking, wheeling and stacking), minimizing the use of the chain saw or lawn mower. And, we have eliminated most of our lawn, replacing it with plants, shrubs and trees, thus expanding our food sources and improving the habitat nearest to our home for all.





The book group has chosen this book for its summer read. On Monday, September 10th the group will gather to discuss this book and choose books for the coming year. All are welcome to participate.




