

LOST AND FOUND

With the increased use of Little River Park and the Pavilion, numerous articles are being left behind, including clothing, sports equipment, sunglasses, etc. Items will be held at the Police Department for one week, after which they will be delivered to the Swap Shop at the Lee Transfer Station.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT ROADWORK UPDATE

- Approximately 500 feet of Pinkham Rd under the power lines (where it gets so rough in the winter) will be reconstructed. This will involve removing the old pavement, excavating the unsuitable material (loam and loamy sand), and installing gravel and crushed gravel. The new gravel will be compacted, graded and repaved. This is tentatively scheduled to start next week. The road will remain unpaved for several weeks so that it can "settle in". During that period the Highway Department will keep it wet and graded as needed until which time it can get paved.
- Also next week or soon thereafter the Highway Department is hoping to replace a failing concrete culvert on Hayes Rd. The plan is to keep one lane of traffic open which may cause minor delays.
- Brox Industries was the successful bidder for paving this year. The following roads are scheduled for paving sometime in August, most likely the latter half of the month; Epping/Berry Rd., Fox Garrison Rd., the paved section of Cartland by Fox Garrison Rd., Pinkham Rd (500 feet), Clay Ln., Newtown Plaines Rd., and Hayes Rd. Stay tuned for more definite dates.

But it's just one dog!

Did you know that just one day's waste from a large dog can contain 7.8 million fecal coliform bacteria?!

Probably the greatest health concern associated with animal wastes is pathogens. Many pathogens found in animal waste can infect humans if ingested.

Organisms such as Cryptosporidium, Giardia lamblia, and Salmonella can induce symptoms ranging from skin sores to chest pain. E. coli, which causes diarrhea and abdominal gas, has been the source of disease outbreaks in several States. Particularly virulent strains of E. coli can cause serious illness and fatalities.

Cryptosporidium is of particular concern because it is highly resistant to disinfection with chlorine. This protozoan causes gastrointestinal illness lasting two to ten days in healthy individuals but can be fatal in people with weakened immune systems. Dog and cat droppings often contain roundworms and other parasitic nematodes. Infection by just a few roundworms usually causes no problems, but more severe infections may cause fevers, bronchitis, asthma, or vision problems.

Dog waste left in the park, your yard, or on the street goes straight into our rivers when rain falls. Studies performed on watersheds have shown that nearly 20 percent of the bacteria found in water samples were matched with dogs as the host animals.

The most effective way for a dog owner to limit their dog's contribution to water contamination is to simply clean up and properly dispose of pet waste!

The first step is to always carry a plastic bag with you when you walk your dog. Reusing an old newspaper delivery bag or plastic grocery bag works well, but if you forget, the Town has now placed a Pet Waste Station at Little River Park, as well as signs around the Park and Town Forest to remind you to always, always clean up after your dog!




