Answer to Last Week's Lee Trivia Question: The Lee 03861 zip code was announced in June 7, 2007 and officially went into use July 1, 2007. Before 2007, all mail was delivered to Lee by the Durham Post Office, using Durham's 03824 zip code. Durham still delivers Lee's mail, but with us all now – of course – using "Lee, NH 03861" for our addresses.

Years ago, prior to the time when the Durham Post Office became the exclusive agent for the delivery of mail to Lee, which post office delivered your mail in Lee was dependent on your geographic location within the town. Some of the neighboring towns that delivered mail to Lee included: Newmarket, Barrington, Epping, and Durham.

Myra Piper Jennison, 92 year old former resident of Lee (now living in Newmarket), tells the story that at some point during the years her mother, Annie Piper, was the Town Clerk/Tax Collector of Lee (1942-1966), Annie was asked to also become the town's post mistress, but respectfully declined the position – and that's when Lee lost having its own post office. It was then that the neighboring towns began delivering mail to Lee residents. One resident in South Lee recalls that their mailing address has - over time – changed multiple times: from RFD # 1, Epping, NH 03842 to RFD #1 with an assigned box number as well (still delivered by Epping with the Epping zip code), to being assigned an actual street number in Lee, but with Durham and its zip code being listed on mail as the address of residence, to finally keeping Durham as the delivery agent but with a street number, Lee, NH, and its 03861 zip becoming the official mailing address for everyone in Lee.

Confused yet?! So were the 3 major credit bureaus and everyone else that the residents of Lee did business with. A local joke at the time was that Lee - like the mythical Scottish town of Brigadoon only appeared for one day every 100 years! The reality of the changing addresses was no joke though and made it appear that Lee residents had moved multiple times when in fact they hadn't. That, in turn, caused all kinds of confusion with folks outside of Lee, not to mention negatively impacting credit ratings until explanatory statements could be filed with state and federal government agencies, banks and other mortgage lenders, insurance companies, and the credit bureaus. Now, after Lee having its own 03861 zip code for 10 years as of this week, the situation has much improved!




WILKINSON FOOD PANTRY Lee Church Congregational 17 Mast Rd
