FAMILY NATURE WALK AT LITTLE RIVER PARK Saturday, July 11th 9:30 am

Usually our monthly nature walks are held on the 1st Saturday of each month, but as July's first Saturday fell on the 4th, this month's walks will be held on July 11. During the June visit to Little River Park, we enjoyed viewing the last of the spring flowers, listening to (and catching glimpses of) a singing indigo bunting, and taking a break to race bark boats down the riffle area of the Little River. July will afford us early views of summer blooming plants, as well as interesting insects. We'll check out the nesting grounds of the awesome, but docile, cicada killer wasp - one of the largest wasps in North America. Birds are still active, with many busy feeding their fledged broods, while others are well into raising a second batch; we'll keep an ear out for who's singing. Also we'll revisit the riffle and race some more bark boats.

Sponsored by the Conservation Commission and the Senior Advisory Commission, family nature walks are generally held the 1st Saturday of every month. We meet in the LRP parking lot at 9:30. All ages welcome!

TROUBLESHOOTING EMAIL FILTERS

If your emails to receive the E-CRIER have repeatedly ended up in your spam folder then your internet provider may have stopped those emails from coming into your spam folder all together. You will need to sign up again and indicate that this is not spam.

If this is not the case, then your provider is blocking these emails and you will need to call them and ask for a 'whitelist'. This will essentially turn off their filter so you can receive these emails.
