GARDEN OF NATIVE NH PLANTS NEEDS YOUR HELP

The six gardeners who are maintaining the Garden of Native New Hampshire plants located at the Transfer Station need your help. If you have an hour or so a week to spare and enjoy gardening please contact Linda Seedner, 659-5384 or email <u>lseedner@comcast.net</u>.

LEARN TO IDENTIFY AQUATIC PLANTS IN YOUR LAKE 9:00 AM Sunday, August 5, 2012

At the Forest Glen Campground, 73 Mast Rd, Lee

Most plants in a lake are helpful, providing animals with a food source, habitat, removing carbon dioxide, and producing oxygen through photosynthesis.....IF they are native to NH waters. When an invasive "exotic" weed enters a water body, usually by transient boat traffic, it grows at explosive rates because it has no natural predators. Exotic plants can tangle boat propellers, make swimming difficult, displace beneficial wildlife, and reduce the aesthetic quality of lakes.

If you're a fisherman, boater, or swimmer who would like to know whether the aquatic vegetation in your lake is beneficial or detrimental to the health of the lake ecosystem, please come to an educational program put on by the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services on Sunday, August 5th, at 9:00 am at the Forest Glen Campground , 73 Mast Rd.

There will be a slide show identifying plants that are common to NH lakes and describing those plants which are invasive, or harmful, followed by a question and answer session. It will probably last an hour to $1 \frac{1}{2}$ hours. NOTICE FROM THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Paving began on the following roads on Thursday, July 19th: Stepping Stones (West & South), Mitchell Road and Toon Lane

Roads will remain open, but will be restricted to one lane, so motorists should expect delays and exercise caution.

PROJECT NOTICE from CONTINENTAL PAVING INC

Continental Paving will be working on the State of NH D.O.T. project "Northwood-Lee", in the Towns of Northwood, Nottingham, Barrington and Lee.

The pavement rehabilitation along US Rte 4, begins at Ridge Rd in Northwood proceeding east 9.9 miles to west of the Lee Traffic Circle. Work will include repairing and replacing guardrail and minor drainage work.

This work will begin on or about July 9th and is expected to be complete by September 28, 2012. The paving work will be performed in the evenings, while the guardrail work will be performed during the daytime hours.

REQUEST for PROPOSAL - NOBLE FARM PROPERTY

The Board of Selectmen of the Town of Lee, New Hampshire is accepting sealed proposals for development of the 69.14+-acre Noble Farm property Tax Map #25-03-000 in Lee. This Town owned parcel is located in a newly formed Light Commercial Zone (Zone LC) and the Town's vision is for a low impact sustainable light industrial/commercial development combining its natural features with light, clean industry, agricultural, and/or research/technology facilities in conformance with Zone LC uses defined in Article VI-a of the Lee Zoning Ordinance. The property has direct access to a State maintained highway near other major highways with unobstructed south facing exposure, adjoining conservation land with a pond, with a 900 foot paved roadway and a pair of drinking water wells approved for 43,000 gallons per day.

The Board will entertain any and all prospective redevelopment or brokerage proposals for the property including outright sale of the property, long-term lease arrangements or other approaches. Proposals must detail the proposer's qualifications and experience on similar projects including 3 or more references with contact information, and preferably provide specifics regarding scope, financial strategy, schedule and/or phase timeline, and conceptual layout plans.
