150,000 POUNDS OF CO2 REDUCTION



Congrats to the Lee Low Carbon team! They dropped a whopping 150,000 lbs. of CO2 per year! (Yes, that's the right



number of zeroes.) Five households completed the four Low Carbon Diet workshops, resulting in an estimated annual 75 ton reduction in their household CO2 footprints through changes and practices that they adopted. The workshop was co-sponsored by the Lee Sustainability and Energy Committees, under the guidance of Jen Messeder and the Low Carbon Diet-Seacoast NH. We expect to offer the workshop again in the fall. Thanks, Jen!

WHEN SECONDS COUNT...

Can the Police, Fire, or Ambulance find your home when you need them for assistance with an emergency? Can they find it at night? Can they find it during a snowstorm?

Having your name and number on a mailbox is just not enough. Some mailboxes are clustered together. The numbers are small and the location may not mark the entrance to your driveway.

The Lee Firemen's Association, in a joint effort with the Lee Fire Department, has started a program to install reflective house number signs at driveway entrances to assist all emergency responders in locating your home in a time of need.

The cost for each sign with a post is \$30.00 and it will be installed by the Lee Firemen's Association.

A LEE FIRE & PLANNING AND ZONING DEPARTMENT REMINDER TO ALL HOMEOWNERS AND BUSINESSES IN THE TOWN OF LEE

A Building Permit is required for all tents that are 400 square feet and over per the International Building Code adopted by NH and the Town of Lee. ATTENTION



Yard Sale season is upon us which brings up an issue of signs being posted improperly. Please remember that advertisements of any kind need to be posted on "free standing" posts not on telephone poles, street signs, markers, posts, etc. If you do put signs out for yards sales etc., please make sure that they do not block the view of traffic, are not on town property, and, if on private property that you have the land owner's permission and that you

remove them once the event is over. Signs that are left behind generally end up blowing away and become trash. Thank you!

CHAPTER 236 HIGHWAY REGULATION, PROTECTION AND CONTROL REGULATIONS Outdoor Advertising - Section 236:75

236:75 No Advertisements of Any Kind Upon Certain Objects. –Notwithstanding any provisions of the law to the contrary, it shall be unlawful to affix, attach or display any advertisement upon any object of nature, utility pole, telephone booth, or highway sign, directly in such a manner that the object of nature, utility pole, telephone booth, or highway sign, is utilized as an integral part of the sign's support as distinguished from being only incidentally a support to the sign, such as the earth or ground upon which a sign is affixed. This prohibition shall extend to all primary and secondary highways and roads of and within the state without exception for any type of advertising. The owner of an object upon which an advertisement is placed in violation of this section shall be entitled to remove and destroy the advertisement and the advertisement owner shall not be entitled to damages or compensation therefor. The object owner shall be entitled to collect the costs associated with the removal and destruction from the advertisement owner or the person who is responsible for placing the advertisement on the object in violation of this section.



COME WALK WITH THE CONSERVATION COMMISSION TO SEE CONSERVED LANDS IN LEE! EVERY WEDNESDAY MORNING

Residents are invited to join members of the Conservation Commission any Wednesday morning while they conduct site walks on the Town's conserved properties. Some of these lands are owned by the Town, but most of them are privately owned and protected in perpetuity with a conservation easement. If you'd like to participate, call the Town Secretary, Denise Duval, at 659-5414. We meet in the Town Hall parking lot at 8:45 am, dressed for walking in the woods. Standard precautions for ticks & mosquitoes are advised. Walks take 1½-2 hrs.

DO NOT FORGET!

Please do not become a victim. WHEN IN DOUBT, DON'T GIVE IT OUT.

The scammers are still out there working hard to steal your money and your identity. The Lee Police Department just took two calls of scam callers that are operating in completely different ways. The 1st call involved a text to a person about an advertising job; driving a car that has been wrapped with an advertisement. The scammer sent a check requesting that the person deposit the check and then send some of the check to the car wrapping company. Luckily the bank held the funds until it was determined that the check was not from a valid account. The 2nd call involved the caller advising they were from the Department of Treasury and were monitoring the victim's address and requesting payment.

Please do not become a victim. Don't release any information or agree to accept a check where you have to forward part of the funds either back to the caller or to a 3rd party.

To report Department of Treasury or IRS scams:

Phone and e-mail Scams

If they claim to be from the Treasury (non-IRS), report it to <u>OIGCounsel@oig.treas.gov</u>. For any report of a fraudulent call, include:

The exact date and time that you received the call(s)

The phone number of the caller

The geographic location and time zone where you received the call

A description of the communication

If they claim to be from the Internal Revenue Service, report it to <u>phishing@irs.gov</u>, subject line: "IRS phone scam." You may also report these calls to the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration, which has jurisdiction over IRS-related matters.

DISPOSAL OF PRESCRIPTION DRUGS


A drop-off is available at the Public Safety Complex to the left of the front entrance for unused and unwanted prescriptions.




NEWS FROM THE LEE HERITAGE COMMISSION!
