FAMILY NATURE WALK AT LITTLE RIVER PARK

Saturday, August 1st, 9:30 am



During our July visit to Little River Park, we walked along the trails leading to the riffle portion of the Little River, where moosewood trees growing along the opposite bank all had chains of seeds hanging over the water. Prairie warblers were singing as we walked through the sandy patch habitat on our way to the other river trail, and everywhere raspberries and blackberries were ripening. Near the trail leading to the meander section of the Little River we found a few clumps of Indian pipe, and along the floodplain we found maleberry shrubs well-covered with seed capsules, a nice clump of not-yet-budded gentian, and jack-in-the-pulpits. The highlight was a red-shouldered hawk which circled the canopy above us as we stood at the river's edge.

Our August walk will include visits to the forest trail that skirts the edge of the old gravel pit, the sandy patch and the riffle. The flowers of high-summer will be in bloom and there should be lots of birds and insects to entertain us. Some of us are constructing miniature Viking ships out of bark, sticks and pitch with mulberry paper sails, which we'll launch along the riffle. Anyone interested in making a ship of their own to launch is welcome to join us; please use only natural materials and keep it small enough to carry in one hand. A small flotilla of little bark boats is a lovely sight!

Sponsored by the Conservation Commission and the Senior Advisory Commission, family nature walks are generally held the 1st Saturday of every month. We meet in the LRP parking lot at 9:30. All ages welcome!



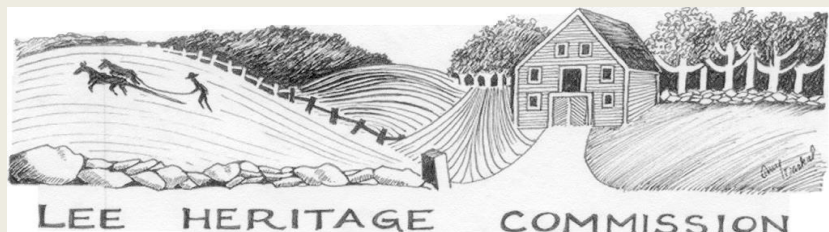

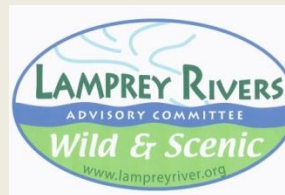

Children entering grades 7-12 may continue to register for our teen program. Fill out a simple form for each book read and be eligible to win a gift card in weekly raffles.

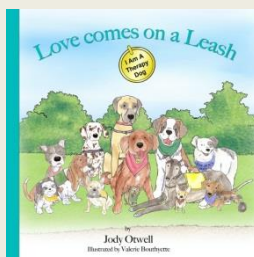

TROUBLESHOOTING EMAIL FILTERS

If your emails to receive the E-CRIER have repeatedly ended up in your spam folder then your internet provider may have stopped those emails from coming into your spam folder all together. You will need to sign up again and indicate that this is not spam.

If this is not the case, then your provider is blocking these emails and you will need to call them and ask for a 'whitelist'. This will essentially turn off their filter so you can receive these emails.
