#### Ingredients

- ➤ Wheat Bread (or bread of choice)
- Sliced Colby-jack Cheese
- ➤ Bacon
- Butter

#### Cooking Instructions

- 1. Cook your strips of bacon as you usually would
- 2. Spread butter on 1 side of each piece of bread, as well as in the pan
- 3. Next, put 2 slices of cheese, bacon and avocado onto one slice of bread, putting the other on the top as a sandwich
- Cook on medium-low until the cheese is starting to melt and the outer crust is golden crispy
